Recently while in revival meeting in upstate New York I crossed over into Ontario, Canada. While passing through a small town called Prescott situated on the St. Lawrence Seaway I noticed a name on a monument in a cemetery that was familiar (Barbara Heck). I had the brother I was riding with turn the vehicle around and discovered that this was her burial place and that of

her husband, (Paul Heck: 1730 -1795). I was familiar with the fact that she was known as the mother of Methodism, but was unaware of her burial location.

Below are the different inscriptions that were on the monument to her memory:
