HEARTLESS HOLINESS By Glenn Griffith

"I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love." (Rev. 2:4).

The whole setting of this scripture containing this solemn indictment against the Christians at Ephesus is surrounded by an atmosphere of unearthliness, and supernatural awe.

The barren island of Patmos with its bleak barrenness, with only a solitary flock of gulls to break the lonesomeness has now become the sanctuary of the omnipotent Christ and His faithful preacher John, who was too hot for the persecutors' oil to burn, had been cast upon this lonely Island to die and be forgotten. But down its lonely pathway walked One who not only came to keep His promise with His disciples -- "Lo I will be with thee, whithersoever thou goest--," but to change its barrenness into blazing glory, and walk by revelation in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks, in all His Omniscience, and omnipresence.

What a spirit of awe must have gripped John, as he turned when the voice of many waters called to him. That voice that sometimes was like a mighty storm when it crashes through the mountain passes, or as the roar of mighty breakers on a rock bound sea shore, or as the quiet whisper of a babbling brook as it ripples in the moonlight on its way to the sea. As he turned he saw in the whiteness of His locks the Ageless one. He was never any younger, and will never be any older. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. His eyes blazed with omniscience, and penetrated the very soul of John, who fell on his face, as one dead. A nail pierced hand was laid

upon him, and that still small voice said unto him, Fear not; I am the first and the last-Write this to the Christians at Ephesus and it shall be to all people in like experience.

"I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love." In His omnipotence He said; I know thy works (this may not have been in commendation), for He said; your works are without love. Just a program. You seem to be satisfied with a crowd -- a big Sunday school -- a luxurious building -- ministering a cold formal holiness without heart-throbs or compassion. Many churches and individuals are trying to satisfy themselves with this "works" program, but no soul burden, just a professional holiness. Yet the world is full of men and women and young people who are lost -- bound by habits -- and crying to be free, but they get no vital held from this heartless holiness. "Thou hast left thy first love."

I know your attitude toward those that are evil, and those who -do not seem to measure up to your standard, saith the Word, and I know you have tried them which say they are Apostles and are not. You can sense the fact they are preaching without unction, but the spirit in which you rebuke them, or discuss them is a spirit without love. Rather a harsh legal spirit. They have no excuse for their sinfulness, and light rejection, and apparent lack of spirituality, but Paul said: (Gal. 6:1) "Brethren if a man be overtaken in a fault, YE which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." Yes, saith the one that walketh in the midst of the seven Golden Candlesticks: You have labored, and hast borne and hast not fainted, but the romance is gone from your work, your eyes are dry, your heart is really not moved.

True the message of holiness is the only hope for a lost generation, but YE are the light that reveals the strength of the message. You are the proof of its deliverance, but your light has gone out. Thou hast left thy first love. Jesus said Ye are the light of this world. (Matt. 5:14) He never said I will give you the Candlestick of Doctrine, but He said; I will set you on fire, and you will light the way through this doctrine, to the fountain opened in the house of David for sin and uncleanness. Better for a light house to fall, and its lights go out on a stormy night on a rock bound coast, than for a Christian to backslide in his heart and light go out, and he become just a carrier of a cold candlestick of doctrine, that has the form of Godliness, but denies the power that delivers from that old carnal nature.

Jesus said; Ye are the salt of the earth, but if the salt has lost its savor, where with shall it be salted... Yes the gospel of holiness is the life line that God has, and is throwing out to the lost souls perishing in the currents of sin and death, but if the Christian who is casting the line has lost his strength, like salt without savor -- Jesus said; he is therefore good for nothing, but to be cast out for men to trample under foot. The savor is the strength of the salt, that gives it seasoning qualities, and taste, and so is the first love of the Christian the strength and seasoning qualities of the Gospel. Without the savor it is but a weak, anemic, nauseating and helpless imaginary hope. Like a mirage in a desert is to a thirsting and famishing wanderer it looks like water but is only an imaginary lake or oasis, which beckons the traveler on until he stumbles and falls famished and lost.

My friend it may look like holiness, and the program will attract a crowd if the sponsors are talented, and are good psychologists, and can project their strong personalities into it through polished and planned social activities or persuade through appeals to the vanity of souls or

appetites of the flesh as they seek for a prize or to be popular, and great reports will be given of the wonderful crowds and service, and yet it will be as empty and dead as a pine branch decorated with presents and false fruits hanging all over it at Christmas time. In like manner this kind of program is just fooling lost souls on their way to the judgment. They thought it was hope, but found only chaff. They listened to talent and voice culture in harmony, and thought it was real salvation, but found in it no strength to deliver them from a burdened heart and a habit-bound life. Oh preacher what a tragedy -- Oh Christian what a judgment is coming. "Thou hast left thy first love."

Yes this emptiness could take on the picture of a so-called program of radical holiness (falsely so called), and the whole, with a spirit of scorn, and censure, because they have only just a little handful of browbeaten or bitter folks, who mind no one else but themselves and their concept of holiness and its standards, who go farther with their opinions than the Bible goes. Some of them are so radical they wander forever feeding at every meeting that is advertised as holiness, but they are never willing to stand up and be counted when an offering is being taken, or a group being formed to do battle for Jesus and a lost world, as there is always something that does not quite suit them. The poor broken, footsore world, with its broken hearts and lost souls finds this so called Christian crowd like the man Jesus spoke of in Matthew who heard a knock on his door in the night and when he arose and opened the door he found a "Friend who had come on a long journey, and was hungry for bread, but when the man turned to look he found his tables EMPTY. He had nothing to satisfy the hungry friend, so is this so called heartless program -- plenty of testimony -- but no bread of life. Oh God don't let us lose our first love, for it doesn't make any difference then what we stand for or against if we have lost the tenderness, and compassion of our first found joy, we have no bread of life to give -- we can only give what we have.

The heart of the experience of holiness is love out of a pure heart -- not mushy love, such as the liberal brethren like to hide behind, but love that is divine in our hearts that makes us really love souls. Love that will sacrifice for lost souls to redeem them. Love that gives birth to vision like Isaiah had (Isaiah 6) until with sin purged-He cries, "Here am I Lord, send me." Love that will pray in its Gethsemane -- "not my will but thine Father." Love that will send young men and women across international boundaries to give their lives in some pagan, far away land, that they might bring the bread of life to the starving suffering souls who have never seen the light of the Gospel, nor tasted of the bread of life.

"Who can count the thousands of souls who have slipped through the channels of so called holiness groups, and individual Christians' hands, and plunged into a hopeless eternity without God and without hope, because a Christian's light went out -- a Christian lost the keen edge or the savor of his experience or the romance of his ministry. If the enemy can rob the preacher of his unction -- the Christian of the victory in his testimony-the pray-er of his groan, he has succeeded in defeating every purpose and plan God made to save lost humanity. God's ambassadors have "lost their first love." Let the preacher carry on his. high type so called program-Let him keep his so-called pace with the TIMES. Let him project his so-called scholarly personality, and masterpiece of firstly -- secondly -- and thirdly perfectness, and its content of thought and composition, but if there is no unction. if there is no real soul concern for the crowd to whom he ministers, they only go home from the service, disappointed, unfed, and the lost wander farther in hopelessness-they came and asked for "a fish -- but they were given a serpent." "They asked for bread-but they were given a stone."

When one thinks of the Christian so-called, and ministers who carry on their lives and task without doing it in the "light of eternity" one cannot help but shudder at what will take place at the judgment seat of Christ, where we will ALL be judged according to our works. The great commission was and is -- "Go, ye into all the world and make disciples," and everyone knows that only when Zion travails will souls be born into the kingdom of God. Only the sermon preached with unction of the Holy One will produce conviction deep enough to cause souls to repent. Only a burdened prayer will create an atmosphere where souls can pray clear through to the experience of the new birth or sanctification as a second work of grace. Paul said, "Though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel . . . let him be accursed." (Gal. 1:8)" God have mercy on anyone who takes lightly this tragedy of leaving their first love, and tries to Carry on in this heart backslidden state. Anything can happen to a person when they lose this life of Christ placed in them through obedience to God's will by the blessed Holy Ghost. The Christian or worker not only will cause many to lose their souls, but will travel out into that state of apostasy, and many will never repent and do the first works again. This path is strewn with the lives of preachers and people who have not only lost their burden and concern and cannot pray for souls, but many are today in indescribable immorality, and no doubt many will never recover themselves. After knowing the love of Christ, and having experienced such fellowship and confidence with God and with unction have proclaimed the glorious gospel of deliverance it is doubtful if they will ever get back. To fall away through the sins of omission, such as failing in the life of devotion -- secret prayer -- or walking in the light of His Word for awhile then go back into the path of rejection and settle down in this make belief life of cold-hearted formal worship is to border blasphemy. They knew the way they should live, but failed to walk in the light. Oh brethren, what will the judgment reveal, when God calls in His stewards, and reviews our lives? There may be some things we cannot do, but God knows and we know that we can keep ourselves in the love of God, and He will keep us unctionized, blessed, holy so we will not be found naked at His appearing.

Dear readers and brethren, God has called us unto holiness, and has provided the atonement for us that we not only can be saved and filled with all the fullness of Christ, but He is able to keep us from falling. We are His light, strength, and the proof of His divine love and grace, and He has sent us, even, as He was sent into this dark world to save souls for His kingdom! How tragic if we cannot pray, and are not concerned about the lost, and try to get them in some other way! If we have left our first love, then God will have to say again "I looked for a man to stand in the gap and make up the hedge, but found none," and again He will have to pour out His wrath upon this enlightened generation, but their blood will He require at the hand of those who have left their first love. This generation has had the greatest opportunity, and had the brightest light. This generation who has had the privilege of the closest relationship to Jesus Christ will stand with bloody hands and face the solemn indictment, "I HAVE SOMEWHAT AGAINST THEE, BECAUSE THOU HAST LEFT THY FIRST LOVE" -- Then shall many say unto Him -- (Lk. 13:2528) "Lord, we have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets. But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are; depart from me ye workers of iniquity..."

Beloved we are all a long way out yet -- may God help us to make our calling and election sure. "Let us search ourselves to see whether we be in the faith." Remember, there is much else besides standards and doctrines. These we must have if we maintain a clean life and church, but there is the greater which is the experience of vital heart holiness. Its melting, compassionate,

humble influence will temper every storm that blows and weep over the erring one and lift up the fallen, and while this old world and formality sits down to eat and rises up to play, we can bring a warm, melting, flowing Calvary to this needy sin-cursed humanity, and be able to meet them with victory at the judgment when our little star is set. And we will hear our Master say -- "Come ye blessed of my Father -- enter into the joys of thy Lord."

How is it this day with you, dear judgment bound friend? Are you honest with God -- your own soul and your fellow man. We don't have to leave our first love, but if you have He said "Repent and do the first works...," and He will receive you. Let us Pray.

THE PROJECTION OF HOLINESS

"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

The mission of the Church, militant, is to spread scriptural holiness to the ends of the earth, promote revivals and prepare the bride for the coming of Jesus Christ. Apart from this, the Church has no reason nor right to exist in the world. When the Church turns from this mission and engages in institutional, secular or social programs then her effectiveness as a witness in the world is lost. To turn to external aids and appliances to further the work of the kingdom is foolishness for the battle is a spiritual one and only the power of the Spirit can conquer. The task of the church is not social, economical, physical, athletical or cultural, but to preach the gospel.

Successful witnessing for Christ depends entirely upon the Holy Ghost. The experience of holiness empowers one to witness at home (Jerusalem), to his neighbors {Judea}, to his enemies (Samaria), and unto the uttermost part of the earth. The Holy Ghost enables one to witness under every situation. The best of workers are helpless without Him and the poorest and weakest with His endument are stronger than the strongest without Him. One cannot have the Holy Ghost and not be a witness.

A number of well meaning brethren have signed their letters "For a clean work rather than a large one." Their intentions are good. They mean that we should not forfeit quality for quantity. While I agree completely with their intentions, I believe our vision should be great enough to comprehend a large clean work, by the help of the Lord.

Smallness does not necessarily imply cleanliness. I have seen some small works that were dirty. In reading the Acts of the apostles, I am convinced that the early church was a large and a clean work. People were swept into the early Church by the thousands. Within one generation they shook the centers of Paganism and spread Christianity throughout the known world. In all probability three or four centuries would have completed the salvation of the world if the Church had continued to grow at the same rate that it increased during the first century. Their hopes were unlimited because their power was unlimited.

The glorious victories of the early Church were won by the Dower of the Holy Ghost, and this is the one and only essential to make the church of today an all conquering force in the earth.

There is an experience for us, similar in kind and degree to that which the apostles experienced. It is similar in kind because the secret of the mighty change in the lives, actions and attitudes of the disciples was not in the power of speaking with tongues, nor in the power to work miracles, but in the possession of the Holy Ghost Himself. The power dwells in the person of God the Holy Ghost. He does not lease out His attributes as some foolishly think; He comes to live in our hearts Himself. To have Him in His fullness is to have power. His gifts vary according to the needs of the church, sometimes bestowed and sometimes withheld, but He Himself remains the same. Glory! Thank God, we are still in the dispensation of the Holy Ghost. The power of God was not depleted at Pentecost nor has it expired all the succeeding ages. He is the same yesterday, today and forever! "The promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." (Acts 2:39)

May God help us to catch a world wide vision and then depend entirely upon God for the enduement to spread the gospel to the ends of the earth. When the heart is cleansed and purified by the mighty Holy Ghost then we can say with Isaiah, "Here am I; send me." (Isa. 6:8) John Fletcher once said to Hester Ann Rogers, "Come my sister, we will covenant together to spread the sacred flame, and testify before men and angels, 'The blood of Jesus Christ cleanseth us from all sin.' "Mrs. Rogers answered, "In the strength of Jesus I will"; and she did, until she went "sweeping through the gates, washed in the blood of the Lamb."

The warm sunshine bathed the countryside in its beautiful light while the tall pine trees gently swayed in the balmy wind that blew on that warm February day. The old camp ground lay in silent stillness except for the screams of some Blue Jays as they darted in and out among the bushes. Far away in the distance the muffled roar of a jet plane could be heard as it swept across the heavens leaving its trail of white vapor against the deep blue of the southern sky.

A good friend, knowing that I would be near the old camp ground, had asked me to post a "for sale" sign upon his cabin. Having finished tacking the sign to the cabin and finding myself in a meditative mood, I leaned against the side of the car and was soon lost in quiet contemplation. The camp ground was silent now but in my mind I recalled the days during the camp meetings when those grounds rang with the songs of Zion and resounded with shouts of the saints echoing over that hill as they shouted praises to the Saviour. Many good and noble men had proclaimed the truths of the glorious gospel of Christ from the platform of that spacious tabernacle. Holiness as an experience with a standard had been emphasized and the long altars were often lined with penitent sinners weeping their way to victory and with believers who consecrated and died to self until the Holy Ghost came in sanctifying power. A host of talented young people had knelt in the saw dust and settled their calls to the ministry and the mission fields of earth. Many a battle in the spiritual realm had been fought and won on that old camp ground. A deep sense of sadness seemed to steal over my soul as I looked upon the side of that cabin and read the words. "For Sale."

The owner of the cabin was one of the best laymen I have ever known. For years he had stood by the church and had been faithful and loyal with his prayers, his presence and his financial support. He and his good wife had always taken keen interest and active part in the spiritual life of the church. Their home was a place where the preachers often met. They not only had a prophet's chamber but they had a prophet's backyard where evangelists were welcome to park their house trailers between meetings or to stay as long as they desired. They had fixed it up for that purpose. Frequently evangelists would stop and avail themselves of their kind hospitality for the hearts of these laymen were warm and their welcome was big.

The annual camp meeting was one of the delights of their lives. They made plans and attended each year. They had sacrificed and saved until they were able to build a cabin on the camp ground to make it convenient for them to attend all the camp meeting services. And now their cabin is for sale.

Why must this be? His religious convictions were the same as they had been all through the years. They were the same that he had been taught by the church which he had attended in his childhood. Though the church bore the same name that it had in the past, it was no longer the same that it had been back in those days of his early boyhood. If he was to keep the convictions and live by the principles which he had always lived by, and if his child was to come up under the same kind of glorious spiritual atmosphere that he once knew, he must step out and leave the church which he had loved so many years, make the sacrifice and start over again.

Though there was much sacrifice involved, he was true to his convictions and stepped out and kept in the will of God. For a time it was necessary for him to open his home for the meetings so that the services of the new church could be conducted in his town. God honored and blessed him for it. The church of his boyhood had let down in her standards which she had held for so many years until holiness was more of a theory than it was an experience and practice. The church school where he had attended college could hardly be recognized now as a holiness school. Many of the women professors have bobbed their hair, while some wear make up and many wear jewelry. Television is an accepted thing among the professors and among many of the students. Only a few are seeking to hold the line of holiness standards that once they held. One dear old professor was shocked and heart broken, when upon asking a large class how many of them attended the picture show, he found that more than half of them openly admitted that they were attendants at the movies. The board of trustees, that once would not permit a student to attend the school while wearing a ring, has now voted to abandon the standard of modesty which the school has held for many, many years. It now permits the boys to play ball in shorts and the girls to play in pedal pushers. Such compromise practices which spring from liberal leadership has forced this good layman to leave the church of his childhood. And now his cabin is for sale.

I knelt on my knees in the pine straw beneath those tall sighing trees and sobbed out my heart to God. With a crushed and bleeding spirit I thought of this good man who is only one representative of a multitude of holy men and women who are confronted with the same problem. I renewed my promise to God that, in a world of crumbling morals and decaying principles, I would stand true to the old paths of the Bible, lift high the blood-stained banner, and preach holiness as an experience with a standard. God came down on the old camp ground and honored me with His presence and placed His blessed seal of approval upon my heart! I drove away from the old camp ground that day with a new determination in my heart, to walk with God, be a holy man and make it home to that beautiful city of God where there will never be a "Cabin For Sale." -- The Editor

With a thrill to place God's tithes in the local church whereas before we thought we had sinned when we did it. Now with joy and holy laughter we give our offerings to missions. We can hilariously give to the saved, sanctified, consecrated, burdened preachers and missionaries who are not over there on adventure trips but for the lost; and at any cost through sweat, blood, and tears.

Since the "New Thing" God has brought into being, our battle is even hotter. We have said to the church world, "LOOK," and they are watching. We have said to the world, "Look," and they are watching. We find ourselves in a very dangerous place. Around the world folk have focused their eyes upon us. It is essential that we take our stand against worldliness in every front. It is essential that we be consistent on the job or in the home. It is essential that we keep the fire and glory and liberty prayed down upon us. But if we are not careful our liberty will become license. In the midst of this "New Thing" that God has brought forth, God says not to remember the former things. It seems that all who came out under the Holy Ghost conviction and that, Scripturally, have experienced the same thing. That is, all the sentiments of the "former thing" have been erased from our hearts. Yet in our forgetting the "Former" and going ahead in the "New" we need caution lest we try to carry over from the "former" into the "new" many of its characteristics. Methods need to be dropped. Terms changed. And above all, we no longer need human pressure groups going around to make it go. It was our sad experience when God left the apostate crowd that human pressure was needed to try to compensate for His departure but now in the "New Thing" we need no human pressure but just more God. We don't need the "promotional program" with some human head driving it through into every camp. If God is in this thing, then let God run it. We need to call our people to prayer. Nights of prayer, prayer at home, prayer in secret, prayer in church, in fact stress more on prayer than on Sunday School. The Holy Ghost stopped this little preacher from counting noses. Don't need that in this "New Thing". Prayer, sacrifice, fasting, seeking God is our only hope. If God is in it then seek more God to keep it going. He will give waters in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

To you who may still be in the "former" and looking to the "new," I say there is no position to offer you. We trust there will never be moves for a position. If you have made known your desire to move to the new front line battle, then we say go look up a store building or tent, or brush arbor and start preaching with the Holy Ghost anointing and you will find yourself in the "new

thing." In this there are no Supts. to fall back on and I trust there never will be. If you are God-called as you claim then get in the battle. If you are a sham then you will illuminate yourself. There will be no position for you to shuffle for and no Supts. for you to leech off of. Men have stepped out of parsonages, salaries, jobs, etc. to move on up higher to the "New Thing."

Jesus said, "Go work today, my son, in my vineyard." From work comes strength; from idleness comes weakness. From work comes power and from idleness comes decay. Work is virtuous and idleness is vicious. The "New Thing" means work and to work keeps one looking upward and onward forever.

"Look up, not down! Do you see how the treetop Rejoices in the sunshine denied to its root; And hear how the lark, gazing sky-ward, is flooding The world with his song, while the ground bird is mute?

"Look Forward, not back!" 'Tis the chant of creation, The chime of the seasons as outward they roll, 'Tis the pulse of the world, 'Tis the hope of the ages, 'Tis the voice of our God in the depth of the soul.

Oh how hungry these people are. From here we had services in the church in the city of the same town, then at Quivican, and St. Augustine. In these places God gave wonderful victories and many souls.

Now we, were taken into a new part of the Island for us where we had never been before. Down into the Pinar Del Rio Prov. where out from the cities they live very primitive, but hungry for God. They welcomed us with such a welcome as I had never received before. It was about three thirty when we arrived at this place of Guane. They greeted us and set about to kill the pig, it was on the table for supper that evening where the dogs, chickens, and the rest of the pigs that were left run in and out of the room where we were eating. A man by the name of Jefferies of Sioux City, Iowa, some thirty-four years ago had a vision of this place, and went among this people, lead them to the Lord. He warned them to accept no other leader until they would find one who would teach them as he did, this man has died. This people said we were an answer to prayer. They are a praying people and have the Spirit of God, with high standards, holding onto God in prayer as much as eight hours a day that a leader will be sent. Their native leader said if we would only stay, he would kill every pig and chicken they had. Needless to say we had great services with many seeking God. There are more than three hundred of this group waiting for us to do something for them. What Will We Do?

Now thirty-six acres of ground can be bought for about four hundred dollars on which a tabernacle could be built for a total of one thousand dollars. They would like to have a camp meeting and convention next winter with our good moderators. Will we take this mountain? May God's rich blessing rest upon us as the Bible Missionary Church and enable us to do His will until Jesus comes.

You didn't stretch it a bit too far, Brother Dodd. May we never be guilty of standing around shaking ladders, finding fault, trying to boss the job when we don't know "beans" about fighting fire. Lord help us to have sense enough to at the least, get out of the way and pray for those who do know how. We do appreciate the humble attitude of our leaders that, if they have gotten the ladder up to the wrong window or are squirting the water in the wrong place, they would appreciate someone telling them.

We're glad to remember that Rahab didn't listen to Sister Worldly-mind or Sister Busybody, or any of the rest of the Sisters, but stayed right there in that narrow little apartment on the wall where the scarlet cord hung out the window. And just as her "Faith" in the "Covenant Relation" brought her "Deliverance in the Hour of Doom" so we too can keep faith in His blood and be ready to go up when doom breaks on this old world. Thank you for this inspiring message, Brother Spencer Johnson. We're going to remember too that "the one who slings mud is losing ground fast."

There were so many good things that we heard time and space will not allow for all of it, but may the Lord help us not to just say, "What a wonderful convention" but also go home to put in practice the good things we heard. This was not only a time of feasting for the saints but the Holy Ghost moved on hearts during the night services and many sought the Lord. There were some that really PRAYED through. Thank the Lord!

WHITHER BOUND SOUL?

By Silas Sanchez

(Continued from last issue)

II. It is in the realm of strong spiritual delusion and rebellion.

1. Delusion: Bed -- when we think of a bed we think of a time of relaxing and rest. This is not so in this case for the eternal bed of the wicked will be a bed of fire with demons to tantalize them with cups of burning gall. Again we think of recuperating strength and refreshing expended vitality. Not so in this case, think how impossible it would be for a poor lost soul to relax, or enjoy comfort and rest, when there is neither in hell. However the passage expresses the delusion that men are willing to believe and lose their souls thereby. In Rom. 1:28; we read, "And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient." Again, Amos 6:1; "Woe to them that are at ease in Zion, and trust in the mountain of Samaria, which are named chief of the nations to whom the house of Israel camel" Prov. 14:12: "There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." Again, 2 Thess. 2:1012; "And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in

them that perish; because they receive not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believe not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness." From these and many other Scriptures we see that men can be lost while they trust in their way as being right. Let us consider three things that are clearly taught here.

1. They gave themselves to a lazy luxurious way of life. Amos 6:la; Many today are taking the easy way of life. They are not willing, to nay the price for a real manifestation of God in their midst. You will note that he was talking to Israel, who is typical of the professor of today. The Church of today doesn't want to carry the burdens of a lost world. They trust in their programs and schemes to bring in the lost about them. Friends, it will take more than that to lead men to Christ. I am afraid that many will awake to find they have missed it by following the way of ease and pleasure in this life.

How will this pleasure loving Church age face this generation at the judgment when they have loved ease too much to pray down real revivals?

- 2. Their delusion: Prov. 14:12; Amos 6:1b; "A way which seemeth right unto man." "And trust in the mountain of Samaria." Many are clinging to a false hope thinking that somehow they will make it through. Some are trusting in the fact that they are honest, have good morals, some on past victories. Then there are those who are clinging to a sinning religion, they are told that they have to sin and cannot help it. The devil promised mother Eve safety in sinning when he put the question in her mind as to whether or not she would die if she ate of the forbidden fruit. She died spiritually immediately, and entailed, the curse of sin on her descendants, but Satan didn't reveal all this to her, she learned when it was too late to avoid the tragedy. She learned at the cost of sorrow and loss. Many today are taking the same course and will awake when it is too late to do anything about it. "But the and thereof are the ways of Death." There are many other things that space will not permit that are serving as a toboggan slide to slip men into hell.
- 3. They rejected God: His Word and plan for their life. Rom. 1:28: "They did not like to retain God in their knowledge." 2 Thess. 2:10-12; "Because they receive not the love of the truth, that they might be saved." Many are like Ahab of old who said he hated the prophet Micah because he did not prophesy good concerning Him. The fact is that Ahab was sinful and didn't want to be told about it. So with many today, as long as the preacher leaves their pet sin alone they think he is all right. But let him go on the TV, bobbed hair, jewelry and immodest dress question and he is off so they think. Dear ones, your best friend is the preacher that will preach you a gospel message that will awake your sleeping soul to its need of God. "They did not retain a knowledge of God." They did not want old fashioned holiness. For God said "Be ye holy for I am holy." If they reject Him they reject His way too, and His will for your life is that you be holy. Without holiness, friend you will not make it. It will be sad to awake to the fact that you missed it when the Holy Spirit has been so faithful to your soul, trying to help you and that you missed by failing to accept His way of truth.
- 2. Rebellion: While some are deceived by the enemy, there are men that rebel at the truth. They rebel at the authority of God. The following Scriptures reveal this fact. Isa. 59:1-8; "Behold the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear: But

your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you, that he will not hear, For your hands are defiled with blood, and your fingers with iniquity; your lips have spoken lies, your tongue hath muttered perverseness. None calleth for justice, nor any pleadeth for truth: they conceive mischief, and bring forth iniquity.

They hatch cockatrice' eggs, and weave the spider's web: he that eateth of their eggs dieth, and that which is crushed breaketh out into a viper. Their web shall hot become garments, neither shall they cover themselves with their works: their works are works of iniquity, and the act of violence is in their hands. Their feet run to evil, and they make haste to shed innocent blood: wasting and destruction are in their paths. The way of peace they know not; and there is no judgment in their goings: they have made them crooked paths: whosoever goeth therein shall not know peace." Read in connection with this Rom. 1:28-32; Isa. 28:14-20; "Wherefore hear the word of the Lord ye scornful men, that rule this people which is in Jerusalem, because ye have said, We have made a covenant with death, and with hell are we at agreement; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, it shall not come unto us: for we have made lies our refuge, and under falsehood have we hid ourselves: Therefore thus saith the Lord God, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste. Judgment also will I lay to the line, and righteousness to the plummet: and the hail shall sweep away the refuge of lies, and the waters shall overflow the hiding place. And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it. From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report. For the bed is shorter than that a man can stretch himself on it: and the covering narrower than that he can wrap himself in it."

Prov. 5:1-5; "My son, attend unto my wisdom and bow thine ear to my understanding. That thou mayest regard discretion, and that thy lips may keep knowledge. For the lips of a strange woman drop as an honeycomb, and her mouth is smoother than oil: But her end is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a two edged sword. Her feet go down to death; her steps take hold on hell."

We see from the above scriptures that one makes his bed in hell by a life of sinful pleasures and dissipation, sowing wild oats, or by a life of willful neglect and inactivity. The manner of preparing the bed in hell then as seen above, is a life of willful, sinful departure from God and his law. From Isa. 28:14-20; we see that men do not only love sin but that they defy God with their sin, seeking a refuge from His wrath. But God sweeps away their refuge, making escape impossible. This is clear from the language morning to morning, day and night. The completeness of their overthrow is expressed in verse 18; and misery of their condition is expressed in verse 20.

To make one's bed in hell that soul must do so in spite of the provisions of God to keep him or her out of hell. Passing over conscience, the BLOOD, the WORD OF GOD, the CONVICTING WOOING VOICE AND POWER of the HOLY SPIRIT, the PRAYERS of saints, Prayers of godly mothers, fathers, loved ones, better judgment, light and all godly influences.

In the natural realm the time of retirement is night. This is a long night. Think of a poor lost soul going away into eternity's night where there is never a ray of light to break the gloom, never a

ray of light to announce morning for there is no morning it is constantly night, constantly dark. For this is that poor soul's eternal doom, banishment from the ILLUMINATING PRESENCE OF GOD FOREVER! "The smoke of their torment ascendeth forever and forever. Forever lost in midnight darkness.
