THE FULLNESS OF THE BLESSING

"And I am sure that, when I come unto you, I shall come in the fulness of the blessing of the gospel of Christ." (Rom. 15:29).

The gospel of Christ not only tells of forgiveness for sins but it declares that there is complete deliverance from the evil nature of sin that came upon man in the fall of the race. "The Fulness of the Blessing," undoubtedly, has reference to the "second benefit," or the "rest that remaineth to the people of God." Paul had experienced this second work of grace while on Straight Street in Damascus and after the passing of the years he contemplates a visit to the Romans and testifies that he is still rejoicing in the fulness of the blessing.

The fulness of the blessing implies the eradication of carnality. Genuine conversion places the soul on a level where it does not commit sin. "Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin!" A person cannot be a sinner and a Christian at the same time. A born again experience will turn one away from all sinful practices and worldliness. "Whosoever is born of God overcometh the world." Worldly entertainments, dress, shows, television, language, and conduct are all left behind when one is truly born again. It is equal to telling a point blank lie to profess salvation when one is gripped by worldly habits, dress and deportment. All this is changes in regeneration.

But the fullness of the blessing leaves no room for even the tendency to worldliness. In the regenerated heart there is no actual practice of worldliness but there is that secret, hidden, regret that one can no longer indulge those worldly desires. There is an inclination to temper. Of course, not a real yielding to it, or a display of it, that would be nothing short of backsliding. But there is that feverish burning inside when one is exposed to provoking circumstances. All these tendencies are burned out by the mighty baptism with the Holy Ghost and fire. Neither is there room in the heart for the fulness of the blessing and a selfish, stingy, penurious disposition or for carnal pride. That old enmity that is hatred toward God cannot live in the heart where the fullness of the blessing dwells.

The fullness of the blessing brings a stability to the soul. Paul speaks of an "establishing grace," and again he writes "To the end he may stablish your hearts unblameable in holiness." (I Thess. 4:13) There is a kind of sanctified stubbornness that is badly needed by this vacillating and unstable generation. This lacking quality would do more to qualify a man for life than all the degrees and scholastic honors he could ever obtain. When the storm is on and the winds are howling, the lightning, flashing, the thunder rolling, and the floods sweeping, God's. sanctified man stands unmoved by all the pressure of the tempest shock. The tendency today is to drift with the tide. On every hand we hear the excuse, "Everybody's doing it." Wrong is still wrong if everybody

does it and right is right if nobody does it. Any old dead carcass can go with the current of the stream. It takes life, strength, will power and grace to stand alone and stem the tide.

There was a day when just good old common American backbone and decency made the average run of men more dependable than a lot of so-called holiness people are today.

Time was, when a God-called, sanctified preacher would answer the call and obey God whether the opportunity was good or bad. The man of God who really has the blessing will preach the truth regardless of the consequences. If promotion depends upon his soft pedaling the message or kissing the toe of ecclesiasticism, he will gladly choose privation and suffering rather than to fawn and flatter or cut corners and compromise.

A sanctified person must be able to say "No" as well as "Yes" and make it stick. A sanctified girl will walk with her fellows only as far as she can go and keep her self-respect and God's approval. Then she will stop and say "no" and refuse to go one step farther. In spite of all the persuasion, pleading and threatening she will stand and never yield. She will walk alone and keep company with her own soul and with the Saviour rather than to compromise her God-given convictions. The fulness of the blessing within her beautiful heart is more glorious to her than all the popular acclaim of the cheap world about her.

A sanctified young man will retain self respect and the trust of others. He will not bend nor break nor bow. A man in possession of the fulness of the blessing is a strong tower to those who put their trust in him whether he be young or old.

The fulness of the blessing brings satisfaction. It is a full blessing. Jesus said, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness for they shall be filled." The blessedness is in the filling. The disciples in the upper room were all "filled with the Spirit." After much persecution and threatenings the Bible again states that they were "filled with the Spirit." Peter speaks of "Joy unspeakable and full of glory." Paul exhorts, "Be filled with the Spirit. Again he leads us step by step until our dazzled senses are staggered with the possibility of being "filled with all the fulness of God!" Glory to God!

All the instincts and yearnings for fulness in the regenerated soul find a spiritual correlative in the Bible. God sees the want and has made provision to supply the need. This very condition of the spirit is a proof of the blessing. The logic of heaven in the born again soul pleads from the premises of a conscious emptiness and yearning for fulness to the irresistible conclusion of such a filling. Just as hunger declares the existence of bread and thirst proves the existence of water and lungs show the need for air so the longing for fulness in the regenerated heart shows there is a fulness of the blessing.

The sweetness and power of the fulness of the blessing of holiness transcends anything in the regenerated life. It is given in answer to a complete and eternal consecration of everything to God. It must be a consecration without a single reservation. It costs everything but is worth all. Many Christians have come to face the cost of walking in the light of holiness. They have looked at it only from time side and not from eternal view. They feared it would bankrupt them to take the step that God requires. They made the colossal mistake of thinking that they could out give God;

they were afraid they would be able to surrender more to God than He would be able to recompense them for. They backed up, shrunk from paying the price and lost what victory they did have.

God's wonderful proposition is that if we will give ourselves to Him, He will give Himself to us. In one of the meetings where I was preaching, an old lady said to me, "I'd give the world if I had the experience you have." I said, "Sister, that is exactly what it cost me." Thank God it is worth all it costs. I have never been a good trader. I lose my shirt every time I trade. Trading is one of my many weak points. However, there was one good trade that I made. It was the time when I traded my poor, tired, peevish, impatient self for the great magnanimous, wonderful, peaceful Christ! Glory to God! The marvelous thing about it all was that He knew I was beating Him but He traded anyhow. Hallelujah! It thrills my heart even today. I am. so unworthy but I am wholly and forever His! He is mine and I love Him today with all my being. The mistakes and short comings of my life have been many but He is faithful and I rejoice in the fulness of the blessing that is mine today! Glory! Glory! I remember when I took the death route and died out to sin and self. But the cost is insignificant in comparison to the blessing that I now enjoy through the merits of His precious blood.

Reader, friend, if you are now a child of God but have not been sanctified, I beseech you to put your all on God's altar and ask Him to burn out all inbred sin. Hold back nothing, put everything and everybody on the altar, father, mother, husband, wife, children, land, property, everything, and He will come!

There was a law in the Old Testament, that when a man brought his gift to offer on the altar in the temple, the priest must appear and receive the offering. It was but a type and figure of what takes place in this day of grace. When an individual lays himself and all that he has on the altar, Christ our great high priest, comes, accepts the gift and the fire falls.

Finally the "fulness of the blessing" sends one out to break the bread of salvation to a hungry world. This was why Paul was willing to hazard his life to carry the gospel to the known world. It will do the same today as in the past. I read of two girls, members of a very formal church who attended a Mission and were sanctified. The moment they received the blessing they began to run over and flow forth to be a blessing. Before this time they had been satisfied with formal church attendance but now they overflowed the banks and backed up to the hills. They could not be satisfied to keep still while men and women by the scores were going down to perdition. They rented a hall, filled it with seats, got an old organ and started a meeting. They didn't know how to preach but they could sing and pray and testify and exhort. In a few days a gracious revival broke out and scores of people were saved. Immediately they were summoned for trial before their church. They were charged with "Irregularity," This was certainly true. They were quite different from what they had been before. A professional mechanical Christian life no longer satisfied them; they were burning up with love for lost souls and were trying their best to keep men and women out of hell. They were saving souls and were in such contrast to their fellow church members that they both looked and were "irregular." Fortunately for the girls, the man who presided over the church court or assembly was both a religious and sensible man. As he asked numerous questions to the young women as to how and when and where they got this blessing and why they did these things, light broke into his mind and he secured their acquittal. His final remark

to the assembly was significant. He said, "from all I can see these girls have received the baptism of the Holy Ghost, and it would be a good thing if we all had it." Amen.

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MANUAL CHANGE

There was one important change made in the Manual at this General Conference. It comes under Part III, Special Rules and reads as follows:

"No minister who has been divorced and remarried or whose companion has been divorced and remarried shall be licensed or ordained while his or her former companion is living except upon the unanimous vote of the District Orders and Relations Committee and a unanimous vote of the District Conference and upon a two-thirds majority vote of the General Conference."

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GENERAL CONFERENCE OPPOSES REVISED STANDARD VERSION

The Second General Conference of The Bible Missionary Church voted unanimously to go on record as opposing the use of the Revised Standard Version as the Bible in the Church, in the Schools or in any of its literature or publications. The Bible Missionary Church does not consider the Revised Standard Version to be a Bible.

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A MESSAGE OF WARNING TO GOD'S SAINTS By Elbert Dodd

Scripture II John 9-11: "Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son.

"If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed:

"For he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds."

Let's notice first of all, who wrote this Epistle. It was John the Beloved. The John that leaned on Jesus' breast, the one that seemed to be the closest to the Lord and the one the Lord revealed the future to in the great book of Revelation. But he lived in a day when apostasy had already set up and he loved his brothers and sisters and God's children and he had a message for them and he wanted to give the message to them. So he wrote this message to, "The elders unto the elect lady and her children, whom I love in the truth." You will notice it was to the elect lady, that is God's chosen people, His chosen church.

Now let's look at this truth which he gave out to God's holy people. Many good, conscientious, holy people are being deceived in this day in which we live. This day is the day of deception. This is the day when many false religions and false Christs are to be found throughout the land. So this warning is a timely warning.

Let us notice the doctrine of Christ. He claimed in many places to be the Son of God. He was born of the virgin Mary and lived among men and when John the Baptist baptized Him, there was a voice from heaven which said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." The doctrine of Christ is the doctrine of Him being the only divine Son of God. Not a son of God, but THE SON of God. Jesus gave forth His doctrines in the great sermon on the Mount in the 5th, 6th and 7th chapters of Matthew.

In this great sermon, His doctrine was a doctrine of pure religion. He taught that one must make his peace with God and then he must have a pure heart. He also taught that there is a heaven. He said, "Let not your heart be troubled, ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions, if it were not so I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you, and if I go I will come again." So He taught that there was a better place and He was coming back to this world the second time.

Not only did Jesus teach that He was coming back the second time, but had His apostles to record this fact. Notice in Acts 1:11 we read, "Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven." This same Jesus as you see Him go away, so shall He come. Many advocate today that He comes into the heart, but not in a bodily form. But the blessed hope of this day, is the doctrine of the second coming of Jesus back to this old world again.

Not only did He teach that there was a heaven, but He also taught that there was a hell. In Mark 9:43, "And if thy hand offend thee, cut it off: it is better for thee to enter into life maimed, than having two hands to go into hell, into the fire that never shall be quenched: Where the worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched." In Luke 16 beginning with the 19th verse, we have a vivid description of a man who lived and died and went to hell. Now friends, these are some of the doctrines of Christ.

He also taught, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me." If He taught anything, He taught self denial. Denial of the world and separation from the world. Through Paul, whom He ordained and gave a special dispensation to give to us, He gave us these words in II Corinthians 6:14-18 which teaches a complete self-denial and a complete separation from the world.

Then He taught that we must keep His commandments. John 14:23, Jesus said, "--If a man love me, he will keep my words:" He gave to us this great book of First John where He said, "And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure. Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law. And ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin. Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him. Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin;" This is the doctrine of Christ against a sinning religion and for a sinless religion.

He also taught that we were not to love the world. He said about His disciples that they were not of the world even as He was not of the world. In I John He says, "Love not the world, neither the things of the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him." No man with intelligence could believe that a person who has the doctrine of Christ abiding in him will love the world or the things of the world. The Bible is very plain about what He means about the things of the world.

Jesus taught holiness. He said, "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." In John He prayed, "Sanctify them through thy truth, thy Word is truth." In I John He says, "If we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His son cleanseth us from all sin."

This is the doctrine of Christ friends. Now comes the warning If there come any unto you and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house. This not only means your house, but yore fellowship. Neither bid him God's, speed. Friends, we can receive him in and bid him God's speed by indulgence, by being unconcerned, by private contribution, and public countenance, and public assistance and open apology and defense.

If one comes in with other than the above doctrine of Christ which is very plain in the Bible, we are not to receive him and we're not to give him any countenance or assistance whatsoever to the furtherance of the doctrine which he preaches.

The second warning, "He that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds." Not only friend, does He tell us not to receive him into our house, but we're not to bid him God's speed in any way. If we do then we're partakers of his evil deeds and we become as guilty as he is and we come under the condemnation of those who transgress and abide not in the doctrine of Christ.

This is a thought we should consider very carefully and we should take it to our own hearts in this day in which we live. If we support liberalism whether it is in literature or any other form, then we become partakers of these evil deeds. If we support a sinning religion and boost a sinning religion who say that one must sin every day and one can be worldly and be a Christian and that it is not necessary for one to have a pure heart, if we support these either publicly or privately and we give our assent and our approval of them, then we become partakers of their evil deeds.

To the ministry especially this word, we should be careful of what we support and what we put our approval on. God help us all to take this message of warning is my humble prayer today.

"Abstain from all appearance of evil." I Thess.

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A RETURN TO THE CAVE ADULLAM By Paul Pumpelly

God had anointed David King over Israel but Saul refused to recognize the Supernatural anointing. The reason was that Saul had compromised and backslidden because he failed to fulfill the Divine purpose of his original anointing as king. Therefore, Saul sought the life of David. David knew that Saul secretly practiced mischief against him. He sought the Lord and was led out of the king's council rooms of federation and collaboration and compromise and escaped thence to the cave Adullam. And when his brethren heard it, they went down thither to him. And everyone that was in distress, and everyone that was in debt, and everyone that was discontented, gathered themselves unto him; and he became captain over them. He arose, and smote the Philistines until

his hand was weary, and his hand clave to the sword, and the Lord wrought a great victory that day. And thirty-three chief men went down and came to David in the harvest time unto the cave of Adullam; and the troop of the Philistines pitched in the Valley of Rephaim.

It was in the month of September and the eighth day in the year nineteen-hundred-fifty-five that a war worn warrior was led of the Lord to withdraw from the fearful compromise and federation with evil within the ranks he served. Not fully aware of the future or even the supernatural anointing given, Glenn Griffith headed for the "Ole Cave of Adullam." When his brethren and his house heard of it they quickly joined themselves to him. The word spread abroad in haste as lightening and many precious brethren who were getting deeper in budgets and finding themselves discontented and running from the fearful cloud of compromise that had subtly caused "General Saul" to perish, took great courage and began to seek the cave. The first general gathering was a year later in the "Old Cave" where many scattered sheep were reunited. Some headed for the cave in spite of kin-folk pressure and other well meaning brethren. They rejoiced at the thought of getting free from ecclesiastical bondage they found themselves in. Once in the cave, they were nourished, some even back to life. The shouts of victory and liberty and the presence of the Holy One was everywhere. Bro. Griffith got up and spread the table and someone got an arm load of peeled pomegranates and passed them out. Whoops and shouts were heard from every part of the cavern. Folk came from the east, the west, the north, and the south. All marvelled at the mighty power of God. The challenge was given to go back to the battle with note to regroup in the cave of Adullam later.

This past September the second great conference was held in the "Old Cave of Adullam." But instead of a few, this time there were great hosts of brethren who had joined themselves to the "new thing." When the warriors gathered in from all battle fronts, they all showed signs of using the past year for getting out of grave clothes, dropping old programs, learning new lessons from the Holy Ghost, and some even had battle scars from the new front. Reports of stonings, tents cut down, cursings, threats of being put into jail, devil bottles thrown at one general, and many other reports that once again hell is being stormed by the sanctified crowd. And as David re-grouped in the cave IN THE TIME OF HARVEST, so did the Bible Missionary Church. Bro. Griffith was used of God the first night in words of fire, the challenge, the harvest, the price. Then problems that had come upon us in the battle had to be solved. One in particular seemed unsolved. The "old cave" was filled with weeping. Personal holiness was exemplified by all brethren. Many fasted and prayed all night. Groans and tears and hearts breaking for God to come solve our problem. Finally after three days of praying, and wrestling with God, Bro. Griffith broke through into the throne room and God spoke the answer. Back in the cave men were weeping and yet believing. Then the climax came when God's anointed got up and spoke the revelation from God. Quickly the warriors were settled with God's solution and once again shouts of victory and rejoicing were heard ringing down the corridors. One was heard to say, down in the lower chamber, that when all were confused as to what to do, the old LION got up and shook his mane and all the folk quickly got together. Everyone could now leave the cave for battle with a clear conscience and unity.

The Holy Ghost came in one service to dispense with preaching and just gave everyone a heaven sent blessing. Some could not contain it and jumped up and down, some ran the aisles, the platform was busy with many climbing up and others running off. Someone looked up into the upper chamber thinking sure that someone might step off in faith. Tears were dripping from every

chin, liberty was given and most took advantage of it. One old warrior said he had been in the holiness ranks for about fifty-five years and in the major "come-out" over forty years ago but he had never witnessed anything like this in his life. To the most of us, it was new. We had seen it in miniature in various places but never in such a large portion as this. Some one said the Holy Ghost was simply putting His approval on the WHOLE THING. Every committee stayed at the job until they were absolutely sure they had the Holy Ghost approval. The church said, THE WORLD IS OUR PARISH, and we make no apology for entering any field. This seemed to bless the Lord and it spilled over on the Cave of Adullam and its occupants. Also when the strong statement that we detest worldliness and demand personal holiness was made, the Holy Ghost Himself seemed to walk the aisles while the "holy people" sat with bowed heads in reverence.

During the last session, someone got up in the "visitors" section and pleaded with the "old warrior" to take him in. When he was told they would consider him later, he jumped up and said it was too serious to put off (it seemed he had put it off too long as it was) and that his wife had come with him to "come out" to come in. They fed them, took them in, gave them credentials, seated them in conference, shouted the victory. And with this sudden defeat to the devil, the devil tried to sneak out the side door but he was noticed and some of the brethren made a face at him.

Once again we had to rally to the thought of departure. The "Philistines" are camped just down the valley waiting for combat. The battle line has changed from challenging backslidden Saul, to actually fighting the Philistines. We find ourselves on a new front. Old fox-holes are left for someone else to defend. We are on new ground, trying desperately to pull men out of the fire. Bro. Dodd said, "the world is on fire." The phrase was coined. Missionaries rejoiced at the soul burden evidenced in the great pledge offering. Doors are opening faster than we are able to fill. Surely God has called the Bible Missionary Church to the front line in such a time as this. The date was set for the next re-grouping in the Old Cave, and we reluctantly left the cave but gladly returned to the front line to engage in the last day battle. Should the Saviour tarry, we shall once again rally to the cave of Adullam and open another cavern to care for the many who shall be pulled out of the fire this coming year.

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THE QUESTION DEPARTMENT

QUESTION: What is the sin unto death?

ANSWER: John said, "There is a sin unto death: I do not say that he shall pray for it." I Jno. 5:16. One would find it difficult to point out any one particular sin as being the sin unto death.

The Scriptures abound in instances to show that men have been pardoned for every form of sin known to man. I find much in the Word to show that one reaches to point of no return, or no place of repentance, or no merciful pardon when he continues to sin after receiving light. Indwelling sin is similar to a malignant disease that destroys the living cells of the body, Innate depravity can slowly destroy man's conscience, faith, and all desire for God, grace and salvation. The soul of such a man will be the graveyard wherein lies the dead of everything that would respond to the appeal of the Gospel. I find four clearly defined aspects of the sin unto death revealed in the Word. (1) Speaking against the work of the Holy Ghost or treating God's call to salvation with contempt. See Luke 12:10. (2) Refusing to go on unto perfection, or rejecting entire sanctification as a second definite work of grace. See Heb. 6:1-6. (3) Willful disobedience. Heb. 10:26-29. (4) Despising the birthright blessing of redemption. The birthright blessing was sold for a morsel of meat. Heb. 12:16-17. This blessing contains all that was lost in the fall of Adam. Jesus holds this blessing by virtue of His appointment as the Heir of all things. Heb. 1:2. When a man shows that he desires the pleasures of sin more than he desires the blessing of salvation he forfeits his birthright for a morsel of meat. Every human being has an inalienable right to receive pardon and purity through faith in Jesus, the appointed Heir of all things. All such privileges can be rejected by man. Such rejection is tantamount to despising a birthright.

QUESTION: Explain I John 3:9. Do the Scriptures teach one cannot fall from grace?

ANSWER: I John 3:9 discloses the infixed law of redemption which rules our lives. God's seed, or children have this law in them, and they cannot sin, because they are born of God. Think of the law of love which regulates a mother's love for her child. So long as her love rules her will she cannot murder her child. If she had no love for her child she could do many things unbecoming of a real mother. The words, "cannot sin" show us that spiritual conduct is regulated by the laws of God written in the heart. See Heb. 8:10-12.

The Scriptures show us that one can fall from grace. There is not one word of Holy Writ to substantiate the doctrine of unconditional security, or "once in grace always in grace." The proponents of this dogma overlook the fact that we must continue in the faith, and be not moved away from the hope of the Gospel. The doctrine of "once a son, always a son" proves too much. If this dogma were true we could never be saved. For "once a son of the devil, always a son of the devil." A natural birth is not by choice of the child that is born, but a spiritual birth is always by choice. Only the most obtuse mind of man would make the natural birth and spiritual birth analogous. The fallacious doctrine of unconditional security is the product of a "sinning religion." It palliates a guilty conscience and comforts the sinful heart.

The special singing of Brother and Sister Cook, Brother and Sister Wheeler and the song about the Crystal Fountain, I Have Found It by Brother Boynton will ring in our ears for months and maybe years to come as well as the singing of numbers of other specials whose record of names we don't have at hand just now.

When the nominees for Sunday School Literature came up the two men whose names were nominated were both so good that once again it took prayer and quite a serious decision to decide as both men were so good and both recommended so wonderfully.

The message by Rev. Elbert Dodd on Thursday evening on Jesus; His Power; His Promise and His Command was seemingly to this scribe one of the finest messages ever coming from the lips of our General Moderator of the Eastern Division. This message was followed by a wave of spiritual giving of \$500, \$300, and \$100 pledges for Home Missions until \$24,265.16 was pledged. Night after night God lined the altars with people seeking and finding the Lord.

A real treat or surprise was in store for all when on Friday morning a fine pastor and his wife who were yet pastoring in Nebraska stood up and testified and spoke their desire of uniting with the Bible Missionary Church. This was followed by scores of testimonies of recommendation as to character, prayer life, school life, and pastoral experience by laymen, ministers and school mates of the one wishing to come our way. Brother Griffith just halted all movement of business and other procedures and stepped to the front of the platform where he asked the couple to come forward and they were duly received into membership amid the tears, shouts and praises of the saints.

On Saturday night in the preliminary part of the service before Brother Roy Lewis preached, Brother Griffith asked for a missionary offering over and above our regular ten per cent giving. The glory was in our midst and the people gave hilariously until there was \$18,245.20 pledged for foreign missions. We praise God for this wonderful vision and burden for the lost of earth.

The Sunday services of the Conference will go down in the history of the Church as some of the best. Almost all available seats were taken throughout the day. The Sunday School hour in charge of Tracy Knapp was turned into an old-fashioned praise and testimony service. Shouting and spontaneous praises were in order in every service. The ordination service Sunday afternoon was Divinely sealed of God as several candidates were given credentials and invested with the full authority of the church. The evening service was a time of heart searching and sincere seeking under the ministry of Bro. W. M. Tidwell. To try to describe the Conference, words are not adequate. God has kept the record and eternity alone will reveal the power and results of this great feast. In that Day many shall come from all directions and sit down in the Kingdom as a direct result of the Second General Conference of the Bible Missionary Church.

If Jesus tarries the next General Conference is planned for June, 1959, at Wichita, Kansas.

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JESUS CHRIST THE MISSIONARY IMPERATIVE By James McNab

I. His Example:

5. For this cause came I into the world (John 18:37b). Just as Jesus Christ could not save Himself from the cross and yet save a lost world from hell, even so the world would have been lost had He not come into this world to shed His atoning blood on Calvary's cruel cross. This was a must in His life because He was the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world. Making possible the redemption of men everywhere was imperative in the life, teachings and example of Jesus Christ. It was for this cause that He came into the world.

Jesus gives His Church another missionary imperative here in His answer to Pilate, which was soon followed by Pilate's historical question, "What is truth?" Jesus calmly states that: "To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth." In chapter 14:6 Jesus had already declared to Thomas, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life"

Christ came into the world to bear witness to the truth, and He, Himself, was and is the Truth. Just as He came into the world to preach the Gospel, and that there might be a Gospel to preach, even so He came to bear witness to the Truth by giving His precious life on Calvary's Cross. Later He committed this great task to His followers, and now everyone of His witnesses must convey this great Truth to all the world.

For this imperative cause He came into the world, to turn men from their erroneous way unto the Truth which would "set them free." For this cause He left His royal home in glory to come down to this sinful world that He might redeem ALL men. This was and is His business. This is why He came into the world, that the world through Him might be saved. John Wesley comments here:

"To this end was I born-speaking of His human origin; His divine was beyond Pilate's comprehension. Yet it is intimated in the words, 'I came into the world --that I might witness to the truth'--which was declared to the Jews, and in the process of His passions to the princes of the Gentiles. 'Every one that is of the truth,' that is a lover of it, 'heareth my voice'--a universal maxim."

And for this cause His followers must leave everything and be crucified with Him, that they might be human embodiments of the Truth, that Jesus Christ might through their lives and ministry be able to set men free. "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). For this cause He was sent into the world, that He, the Truth, might defeat error and set men free. Therefore, it is imperative that all His followers be awakened to their tremendous responsibility of making Him, the Truth, known to all those who have never heard the Gospel. Kenneth Bedwell observes that:

"The world has been defined as 'organized society in opposition to God,' but Jesus Christ never forgot that within that organized society, blinded and deceived, there were men and women who could be won back to light and life and love and holiness. He was hated by the world, but He loved the souls of men, and bore their sins in His own body on the cross.

"Our task is to go back into the world from which God has delivered us, and from which He has separated us, to snatch men as brands from the burning. We are not to be so 'Heavenly minded that we are of no earthly use.' This otherworldliness does not become preoccupied with its own sanctity, while souls are perishing. No, it takes off its coat, and rolls up its sleeves, and goes down to the very gates of hell, until it can feel the very scorching of the fire, in order to rescue poor deluded and wrecked humanity."

This is exactly what Jesus did. He suffered the very pangs of hell in order that He, the Truth, might set men free from their shackles of sin and prevent them from spending an eternity in hell. Now those of His disciples who have been set free, are obligated and called to go forth into ALL THE WORLD to rescue men and women who are bound and set them free by declaring unto them the Truth, the saving and transforming Gospel, Jesus Christ. They are wandering around in the dense darkness of sin and superstition, and only Jesus Christ, the TRUTH, can set them free. It is imperative, therefore, that WE take Christ to these lost multitudes at ANY COST!
