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BLOODY HANDS

Scripture: Psalms 24:3-4:

"Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? Or who shall stand in his holy place? He that hath clean hands and a pure heart."

Some people believe that Christ's greatest value is to be found in His teachings. His flawless code of ethics and perfect law of Love is unexcelled. But, the main purpose of Christ's life was not to teach.

Others insist t hat Christ's greatest legacy to earth was His stellar example of life. We do not want to detract in the least from His life which was perfect. However, there was more to accomplish than just living a perfect life here on earth.

Many think that Christ did His greatest work in healing the sick, the halt, the maimed, and blind, or in raising the dead. Truly this was a much needed work in that day and no one should minimize it. But, Christ had a greater purpose than all of these.

Christ came to die!

Matthew tells us, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins." Jesus did come to save men and women from sin, but He knew that without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin. Therefore, He came that by one offering He might forever provide an atonement for man's sin. To make this offering He had to die.

He was born in poverty, He grew up in poverty, He lived in poverty, and He died in poverty. He said, "the foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay His head." To pay His taxes He had to send one of the disciples to catch a fish and get a coin out of its mouth. He, who owned the earth, the planets, the stars, and all the universe even to Heaven itself, was suffering the pains of poverty that He might save souls.

"He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief." A world which should have rejoiced that its King and Savior had come, sought His life. King Herod tried to kill Him when He was born. His own countrymen; whom He came to save, cried Hosannahs on Sunday and five days later screamed, "Crucify Him, Crucify Him." The Church of that day rejected Him and finally succeeded in bringing about His crucifixion.

These things were enough to bring sorrow and grief to the heart of Jesus. But, in the hour of His greatest struggle His disciples could not watch and pray with Him one hour even though "His sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling to the ground." When in the hour of His greatest need His disciples forsook Him and fled. One of them even led His captors to the garden and then placed the kiss of betrayal on His cheek. While He was on trial for His life, one of the most faithful denied Him thrice.

In order that He might save souls, "His visage was so marred more than any man, and his form more than the sons of men." By the chief priests He was smitten, spit upon, scorned and ridiculed. The Romans scourged Him, arrayed Him in royal robes and placed a crown of thorns on His brow :then: subjected Him to the mockery of the crowd. Finally they placed a cross on His shoulder and led Him to Golgotha's brow.

There they suspended Him between Heaven and earth. While the crowd mocked and made fun, the sun, the moon and the stars hid their faces. Jesus was drinking to the last dregs the cup His Father had given Him to drink. He who knew no sin became sin. "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with, his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all." Murder settled in the cup. Blasphemy made its way into the cup. Your sins and mine found their place in the cup. The poverty, sorrow, suffering, the Cross and all the sins of the world were in the cup and Jesus drank the cup.

"Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friend." Jesus laid down His life for His friends. But He surpassed the love of man and laid down His life for His enemies; those who would reject Him, persecute Him and say all manner of evil against Him and His cause. After He has done so much surely Christianity should give to Him the best that they have. But do they? Let us listen to a communist tell of the thanks which Jesus receives from Christianity.

In his book Wake Up And Lift, C. William Fisher gives this statement by a French communist: "The gospel is a much more powerful weapon for the renewal of society than is our Marxist philosophy. All the same, it is we who will finally beat you. We are only a few, and you Christians are numbered by the millions, but we Communists do not play with words. We are realists, and seeing that we are determined to achieve our object, we know how to obtain the means.

"Of our salaries and wages we keep only what is strictly necessary; and we give up the rest for propaganda purposes. To this propaganda we also consecrate all our free time and a part of our holidays. You, however, give only a little time and hardly any money for the spreading of the gospel of Christ. How can anyone believe in the supreme value of this gospel if you do not practice it?

"If you do not spread it, if you do not sacrifice either time or money for it, believe me, it is we who will win, for we believe our Communist message and we are ready to sacrifice everything, even our life, in order that social justice shall triumph."

"But you Christians are afraid to soil your hands or to suffer an ache or a pain for one you call Lord, Saviour, coming King!" What an indictment against Christianity!

How can God have mercy on a people who treat their Lord, Saviour, and coming King with such thanklessness? 'No wonder there is a day of wrath to come. No wonder there is a Hell which will burn throughout eternity.

You might try to soothe your conscience and say that it is speaking of the worldly churches and not the Holiness churches. Is it? Have we the members of the Holiness churches escaped this paralysis of sleeping sickness?

Everyone has seen the members of false doctrines passing out their literature on the street corners. Many have had members of a sinning religion knock on their door. Others have had errors presented to them in various ways. Stop and think!!

How many times have you seen a holiness person passing out holiness literature, knocking on doors, or witnessing to the lost? It is easy to criticize others, but what of yourself. Did you ever pass out holiness literature, or even revival meeting announcements? Have you knocked on doors much -- if any? When did you last witness to a soul about Jesus and what He has done in your heart?

In her book "Things As They Are," Amy W. Carmichael tells this experience:

"The tom-toms thumped on all night, and the darkness shuddered round me like a living, feeling thing. I could not go to sleep, so I lay awake and looked; and I saw, and it seemed like this:

"That I stood on a grassy sward, and at my feet a precipice broke sheer' down into infinite space. I looked, but saw no bottom; only cloud shapes, black and furiously coiled, and great shadow-shrouded hollows and unfathomable depths. Back I drew, dizzy at the depth.

"Then I saw forms of people moving single-file along the grass. They were making for the edge. There was a woman with a baby in her arms and another little child holding on to her dress. She was on the very verge. Then I saw that she was blind. She lifted her foot for the next step -- it trod air. She was over, and the children over with her. Oh, the cry as they went over!

"Then I saw more streams of people flowing from all quarters. All were blind, stone blind; all made straight for the precipice edge. There were shrieks as they suddenly knew themselves falling, and a tossing up of helpless arms, catching, clutching at empty air. But some went over quietly and fell without a sound.

"Then I wondered, with a wonder that was simply agony, why no one stopped them at the edge. I could not. I was glued to the ground, and I could not call. Though I strained and tried, only a whisper came.

"Then I saw that along the edge there were sentries set at intervals. But the intervals were far too great; there were wide, un guarded gaps between. And over these gaps the people fell in their blindness, quite unwarned; and the green grass seemed blood-red to me and the gulf yawned like the mouth of Hell.

"Then I saw, like the picture of peace, a group of people under some trees, with their backs toward the gulf. They were making daisy chains. Sometimes when a piercing shriek cut the quiet air and reached them, it disturbed them and they thought it rather a vulgar noise. And if one of their number started up and wanted to go and do something to help, then all the others would pull that one down. "Why should you get so excited about it? You must wait for a definite 'call' to go. You haven't finished your daisy chains. It would be really selfish" they said, "To leave us to finish the work alone."

"There was another group. It was made up of people whose great desire was to get some sentries out; but they found that few wanted to go, and sometimes there were no sentries for miles and miles at the edge.

"Once a girl stood alone in her place, waving the people back; but her mother and her relatives called and reminded her that her furlough was due; she must not break the "rules." And, being tired and needing a change she had to go and rest awhile; but no one was sent to guard her gap, and over and over the people fell, like a waterfall of souls.

"Once a child caught at a tuft of grass that grew at the very brink of the gulf; the child clung convulsively, and it called, but nobody seemed to hear. Then the roots of the grass gave way, and with a cry the child went over, its two little hands still holding tight to the torn-off bunch of grass.

"And the girl who longed to be back in her gap thought she heard the little one cry, and she sprang up and wanted to go; at which her relatives reproved her, reminding her that no one is necessary anywhere -- the gap would be well taken care of, they knew. And they sang a hymn.

"Then through the hymn came another sound like the pain of a million broken hearts wrung out in one full drop, one sob. And a horror of great darkness was upon ME, for I knew what it was -- the cry of the blood."

Communism exists on the bare essentials. Christianity lives on the fat of the land. Communism keeps only what is strictly necessary of their salaries and wages. Christianity is doing well to pay its tithes, while offerings fall somewhere in the background poverty stricken and forgotten. Communism consecrates all their free time and part of their holidays to the spreading of their gospel. Christianity does good to get to church on Sunday morning, once in a while on Sunday night, and rarely, if ever, on prayer meeting night. All free time and holidays are spent in their own interests. The Gospel of Christ is forgotten -- at church. Communism is ready to sacrifice everything, even their life that social justice shall triumph. Christianity cannot sacrifice a meal or miss a little sleep in order to pray and fast. How could they be willing to sacrifice their lives? Communism is winning the world. Christianity is being won.

The blood of Abel cried to God from the ground. The blood of the billions of lost souls are today crying to God. God required the blood of Abel at Cain's hands. God is requiring the blood of the world at our hands. If we do not sacrifice more time and money, if we do not do more to spread the gospel of Christ the world will be won by atheistic Communism and go to Hell. And we shall stand before the Judgment Bar of God with BLOODY HANDS. From our finger tips will be dripping the blood of our relatives, friends, neighbors, America and the world; but most of all the blood of Jesus, who died to save the world.

Is it any wonder that the text says: "Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? Or who shall stand in his holy place? He that hath clean hands and a pure heart."

In that day will your hands be clean or BLOODY?

THE PERILS OF HOLINESS

"The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good seed in his field: But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way." (Matt. 13:24-25)

The Devil does not die just because a person gets sanctified. Neither does he cease to tempt a man because he has a pure heart. If the enemy attacked the innocent Adam in Eden and assailed the spotless Son of God while on earth, we may well expect to fight some battles to maintain a sanctified experience. "For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin." (Heb. 4:15)

The experience of a holy heart enables one to live completely victorious over sin in this life and greatly reduces the danger of backsliding, but there is no state of grace from which man may not fall. "The power to sin is one thing, the proneness to do so is another. Sanctification takes out the latter but 'leaves the former, which is an attribute or necessity in a free moral agent who is working out salvation. The proneness to sin may be removed, while the power to sin will remain until life is ended and we sweep into heaven, where we can not sin. So with this power angels fell somewhere in the skies. Adam fell in paradise, and regenerated and sanctified people can fall in this present world." (B. Carradine)

After the Jordan crossing, the children of Israel still must take Jericho and Ai. Giants were to be defeated and Canaanites put to route. Through the tragic deception and fall of our first parents, Gibeonites are allied with the soul in the form of mental and physical infirmities. They can not be slain but must be kept under in the place of servants as "hewers of wood and drawers of water." So there are some perils in the sanctified life.

There is the peril of entertaining temptation. The Devil will stay and soon gain the victory where little or no resistance is offered to his subtle suggestions. "The evil thought is the forerunner of the Devil." The Devil knows that if he can get a holy man to entertain the evil thought, he will in time, permit entrance to the originator of the temptation.

Sin, to a free moral agent, must first present itself to the mind. The picture or thought of evil comes. "It is in the power of man to immediately reject the thought and allow it no lodgment even for a moment. This is what should be done and is done by many. But if the conception or picture is allowed to remain in the mind, it passes at once into the region of the sensibilities, and a commotion is felt within as a result. If still cherished the realm of Desire is invaded and a longing for the forbidden thing is realized. The next stratum of the moral nature that is now entered is the Will. The man determines on the act of commission. Then after the determination of the Will sin emerges into daylight in the form of an act." (B. Carradine, The Sanctified Life, p. 45)

The moral and volitional powers of man make possible the entrance of evil as well as the possibility of the admission of good. If a man could not have any thoughts of evil then he could never be tempted. The time to resist temptation is when the thought first presents itself to the mind.

It is better to flee like Joseph and win than to try to stay in the presence of the temptation and lose. Thoughts of evil will come, uninvited, to the purest man but one can pull his mind away from the evil and think on something good. If thoughts of evil are allowed to dwell in the mind, they will become evil thoughts and will soon enlist the Will and plunge one into sin. Sin results from entertaining the wicked thought. The experience of heart holiness cleanses the heart and mind but it is the task of the holy man to control his thoughts. "Whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." (Phil. 4:8)

The "cares of life and the deceitfulness of riches" constitute another peril to holiness. Jesus placed them together and there is a definite relation between the two. In the battle for physical existence, who has not felt the cares of life? The many cares of life would lead one to believe that if only riches were in his grasp the cares could be relieved. But the fact is riches are deceitful and the more one has, the greater the demands and responsibilities are, until what once would seem to have brought satisfaction becomes only a feeder to increased desires and the cares, instead of diminishing are multiplied. In yielding to this many have hampered their power as a spiritual force in the world for God. Happy is the man who has learned to keep his requirements small and his desires simple, who has learned to cast all his care upon Him and that by seeking first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness all things that he needs shall be added. "But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content. But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition." (I Tim. 6:6-9)

Then there is the peril of self sympathy. Outward trials and afflictions do not cease because the soul is sanctified. The early Church after Pentecost abounded in afflictions as well as in joy. If the Devil can get one to feeling that his lot is a little harder than that of someone else and inject in the heart and mind a little worry, fret and fault finding, a little self pity and get him to feeling sorry for himself, he will have succeeded in opening the way for defeat and loss of the holy experience. How the enemy would like to make one feel that God is a little too hard on him by requiring the peculiar life of suffering and loneliness. Too often he succeeds in getting people to measure their ideals and standards of Christian living by what others think and do rather than by the Bible. The Bible is clearer on all things pertaining to ethical living than many seem to realize. The question should ever be, "What saith the Scriptures?" rather than "What do my friends and associates think or even the opinion of the best people I know?" On the surface it may appear that people are getting by with things about which there may be questions in one's own mind and heart. It is well to remember that we are this side the judgment and after all, in the sight of God they may not be making it so well.

The Bible is the criterion of truth in this life and it will be the standard of judgment on that great and final day. "For we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: but they measure themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise." (II Cor. 10:12) "For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth." (II Cor. 10:18)

The holy man also must guard against the peril from the physical. Paul declared that he kept his body under. This does not refer to the carnal mind for that is eradicated when one is sanctified but it refers rather to the subjugation and moderation of the legitimate desires. Every worldly, carnal desire is gone from the heart of the holy. The sinful habits are broken in regeneration. But there is great need for the holy man to avoid slothfulness, laziness and untidy habits of living as well as the excessive indulgence of his legitimate desires. Multitudes of holy people are accomplishing little or nothing for the cause of God because of a lack of systematic living. They operate their lives on a hit and miss schedule. They have no particular time to read and pray or do anything else. They have fallen into lazy physical habits and are in danger of backsliding from pampering the flesh. Many preachers as well as laymen drone away a considerable part of their lives.

The peril of arrested progress has paled numbers of bright experiences that were ignited by the Lord. For a while they were a shining light but they became satisfied with present achievements until the experience grew dim and finally disappeared. In the early stages of their experience they were glad to witness to the blessing but by and by their ardor cooled and they lost out. Like the ant or the wasp, they were bigger in their beginning than they have ever been since. By neglecting the means of grace they grew progressively smaller in their soul. Purity is not the Christian's goal. "Sanctification puts a finality to nothing except sin." Growth in grace is not arrested but accelerated when one is sanctified. One may be pure but still stand in need of maturity. One should ever reach out to new heights and depths of grace. The running stream is the healthy stream. The natural tendency to let well enough alone often betrays one into letting that which is not well enough alone.

We are saved and sanctified by faith alone but our experience will not remain if we neglect good works. In one of his books, Carradine tells of a church member who had been careless in regard to this kind of spiritual activity. One Sunday his pastor preached on Heaven. A combative, skeptical spirit arose in the man's heart and he said, "You speak of Heaven, but can you give me any idea as to the location, whether in the center of the universe or close by us in our own solar system?"

The pastor replied, "I will give you my views at another time. Let me now speak to you about something else. Do you see yonder little house on the hill?"

"Yes," replied the man.

"Well, in there lives a woman, poor, sick and helpless. She needs coal, food and consolation. I wish you could drop in a few minutes some time and see her."

That very afternoon this gentleman, who was a man of some means, went to the little house. With him he had brought certain things in the shape of fuel and provisions. He sat an half hour by the side of the invalid, read a chapter in God's Word, sung a hymn, and kneeling down prayed for her. On leaving he placed a five dollar bill in her hand. The next day he met his pastor on the street and calling him aside said:

"I asked you yesterday where heaven was. You need not tell me. I have found out. Do you see that little house on the hill? Well, it is there! I found it there yesterday afternoon as I talked and .prayed with a sick woman; and it is also in my heart."

If all of our people could just take one trip to a darkened land, and see the working of the Holy Spirit, see the shine on the faces of those who have been delivered, and could see how appreciative they are of having the true Gospel I am sure all would double their efforts to get this Glorious Gospel to the ends of the earth. I praise God for the small part I have had in sending this glorious Gospel to the needy world. Let us all pray more than ever for a dying sinful world. This is our day -- we must not fail God and this age.

This is plain and self explanatory, concerning the exchange of dress, yet millions are sinning every day (holiness professors in homes, churches and schools no exception) by willfully going against the Scriptures. Of course many will plead ignorance, and many will say that was under the law." Many like the woman who said, "I wear them so when I climb the windmill I'll look modest." Better stay off the windmill. Oh, the stupidity of excuses that people make for sinning. God says what He means, and means what He says. To doubt it, to not believe it or to alter it, is to sin, and to sin is to die. Ezekiel 18:4, "The soul that sinneth, it shall die." Not rest -- not lose fellowship -- but "it shall die" eternally doomed and damned without hope.

Concerning the question of immodesty, let us look at "thus saith the Lord." 1 Timothy 2:9-10, "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness, and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold or pearls, or costly array, but (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works." Notice verse 10, women professing (or men no difference). The implication here is if you profess it, you do something about it, put some clothes on, and take some junk off. Many professing today, but not too much evidence of change. "Wells without water." "Clouds without rain." Of course the only folks who really believe the

Lord means business, are those who have "come out from among them" -- "Love not the world" -- "Abhor that which is evil."

We look at a sick and miserable humanity steeped in sin, and cry out "horrible," but how few they have to look to for a better example. The churches on the whole, are dead and anemic, and preachers, their families and the congregation, are following the patterns and fashions of the world. Cause for much of the nudity and immorality of today, can be placed on the compromise in the church. Cap sleeves -- no sleeves -- low necks -- no necks -- tight sweaters and clothes -- shorts -- jeans -- peddle pushers -- bathing suits -- sack dresses. God pity foolish womanhood, who think they have to change fashions, every time the devil speaks, and these poor weak-headed, knobby kneed men, who have to wear their shorts to keep cool and to make sport. Jeremiah 6:15, "Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? Nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore they shall fall among them that fall: at the time that I visit them they shall be cast down saith the Lord." No excuse and no hope for disobedience.

This abomination has had a most telling effect upon the world and the church. The problem is before us, the results that have been produced, and are being produced by it are enormous, broken homes, broken hearts and souls damned for eternity. God has given a most serious warning to all, concerning one of the results of immodesty. The sin of adultery. Matt. 5:27-28, "Ye have heard it said by them of old time, thou shalt not commit adultery." Notice Jesus said, "You have heard." Not anything new, it was given to Moses on Mt. Sinai. "Thou shalt not commit adultery," the physical act denounced and forbidden.

Ver. 10, "But I say unto you, that whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart." This puts added light to the commandment, and is so plain and definite, it should need little explanation. Jesus Himself said this, the men of old put emphasis on the physical act, Jesus put it on the eyes. "Whosoever looketh." Too many are looking too long in one place, too much being transmitted from the eye to the heart. The results adultery. Remember one look of the eye, can put you in hell, just as surely as if you spend your nights with a harlot. No adulterers in heaven, all in hell.

We are living in a day of exposition. Women and men exhibiting themselves on the streets, in the home, and even in the churches. People will spend hours and play with words, making excuses as to why they don't wear sleeves in their dresses, why they wear tight sweaters and skirts, why they wear shorts, peddle pushers, slacks, bathing suits, transparent blouses, halters, Bermuda shorts, sack dresses, chemise dresses, men with no shirts. Now an excuse for doing something is one thing, the motive for doing it is something else. Pin point it, trace it, (when conviction comes it proves it) and here are the motives: pride -- indifference -- ignorance or sensual desires, which would include: enticing, inviting, and exhibiting. All have been contributing factors to the terrible crimes of our day. A noted criminologist in his book "Sex and Law" said, "Of most of the cases he questioned, people who had been convicted of "exhibition," confessed their motive. In every case it was confessed to be a means of sexual stimulus, if not satisfaction, when they exhibited their person to the opposite sex. This is not a charge, but actual confessions of those who were convicted of exhibition. This was their confessed motive. Thus as a fact, motive for nudity, sexual stimulus or satisfaction. Perhaps not everyone's motive for their nudity, but a fact it is a motive -- a confessed motive.

No wonder sex crimes are at an all time high, divorce rates rising daily, unwed mothers and illegitimate children filling the institutions. God has been forced out of government, out of the school, out of the home, and is fast being pushed out of the churches. You say you can't push God out. Oh, but He doesn't leave until we force Him to, by our actions, which is the way we live.

In the 22 chapter of Ezekiel, God catalogued Jerusalem's sins, and told Ezekiel, "Thou shalt shew her all her abominations." That city was steeped in sin; lustful, abominable sin. It didn't make a very pretty picture. No doubt they accused Ezekiel of harping on things in that day, but he preached what God told him to just the same, and didn't bow down to please the D.S., the D.M., or the D.D. He preached without fear or favor.

Have you catalogued the sins of your town? Remember, my town includes, my life, my home, and my church. God told Ezekiel to name the abominations. If you cry out against immodesty, immorality, and call sin by its right name, it will cause a stir. Praise the Lord. Take heart, O fainting soul, the biggest and loudest wail comes from the poor old backslidden holiness professors, who like their sins. Think of the poor folks that would probably die of broken hearts, if America and the church began to put on decent clothes. This may sound light, but it's serious. Revival in America is the only answer. Sudden destruction awaits us, for the let down in morals.

Ezekiel 22:30. "And I sought for a man among them. that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land. that I should not destroy it: but I found none." What a sad conclusion. God is seeking for men. to cry out against sin, make up the hedge. Anyone who has seen an old hedge fence, knows how hard it is so get through. Stands so close, so rooted. it just doesn't give way, every time the old goat wants to get into the clover patch. If he's determined to get in, he can make it, but by the time he gets into the clover, he'll realize he didn't have near enough covering on. Not too many going through the hedge in these last days. The ecclesiastical axe has been laid to much of the hedge, the gaps have become washouts, the church and ministry whitewashed, sitting idly by, waiting for destruction.

May God help us to cry out: wake up, clean up, cover up and move up for Him.

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WANTED -- DEAD MEN George E. Bowen

Rom. 6:11, "Dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God."

The work of God demands crucified laborers who are dead to popularity, position, and personalities as truly as though they had actually ceased breathing. They must be men unspoiled by

the schools, unlearned and ignorant as far as the world's evaluation of intelligence is concerned, and undisturbed by man or movements-men of one book. It would matter little if they could tell a professors degree from a prisoners serial number as long as they carried the stamp of God's approval on their lives. Perhaps it would be well if they had never read the works of our prominent forbears, never saw a book on psychology or philosophy, and never heard an oration by our present day educators.

What lightning bolts of divine truth would attend their ministry if they, like Paul, could absent themselves from public life, retire to some sort of solitary Arabia and there, with only one book, seek to be influenced by it and it alone! In such solitude they would learn to hearken to no voice but the voice of God, bend to no personality but the personality of the Holy Ghost, and be influenced by no books but the book of God. They would pray, preach, and work, not merely because of the good examples set forth in history, but because of the direct dealings of a faithful God. They would be dead to good men and bad men alike, unmoved by the loving advice of their fellows. Dead men are naturally unaffected by applause or censor; spiritual success or seeming failure. 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THE SUBTLETY OF TELEVISION By Spencer Johnson

Honest people seriously doubt if anyone ever really controls television. The reason is that they cannot know what is coming next and when the evil picture flashes, even though they may turn it off, it has already left its impression on the mind.

Even, so-called innocent programs may be filled with evil that has its deadly effect upon the heart and mind without the individual being aware that he is imbibing it. An article which appeared in the Phoenix Better Business Bureau Bulletin, January 1958, states: "Subliminal advertising is the brainchild of James M. Vicary, 42-year-old head of a New York marketing and research firm.

The technique: Flashing ad messages (like "Eat Crispies") on the screen at such speeds viewers are not aware they've seen the ads.

The theory: Although the viewer isn't conscious of seeing the ad, his subconscious mind duly notes the message.

A new Vicary organization called Subliminal Projection Company put its technique to test in a New Jersey movie house. Intermittently during movies, "Eat Popcorn" and "Drink Coca-Cola" were flashed on the screen.

Over a six weeks period, popcorn sales increased more than 57 per cent while Coke sales jumped more than 18 per cent.

Since the experiment, in which 45,000 movie-goers unwittingly participated, the furor over subliminal advertising has raged.

Would beer ads unwittingly subvert minors? Could a sponsor use the technique to smear another's product with an ad such as 'Burchies are stale.' Could political parties buy up enough TV time to suggest their way into power?"

There is great potency for evil in the little ad that isn't there but is. And yet there are many who still justify their worldly desire for the TV by claiming that TV is O.K. One preacher went so far as to say that his television was sanctified. Of course, thinking people know that such a statement borders on blasphemy.

VISITING THE OUT STATIONS By Dennis H. Reiff

[See Graphics\hdm1682a.jpg] -- Mission Jeep and a group of native men at a village high in the mountains of Guatemala. The trip was made to bring a sick person down to the hospital.

Along with the many duties and responsibilities that we have here in Jalapa, wife and I arranged to have some time to visit the pastors and their congregations.

The first place visited was San Juan. We left out on Wednesday afternoon in the Jeep, soon after dinner, and arrived in about an hour. Wife spent some time visiting with the women in their

homes, while I stayed and watched the Jeep and visited with the men who came around. That night the Lord gave us a good service in the little chapel, with a good crowd. It was a time of blessing to us all. We returned after the service in order to be here to begin the duties of the next day.

Monjas was next on the list, for Friday night of that week. Going early in the afternoon, we visited various homes and prayed for the sick. Time ran out for more visiting, so we returned to the parsonage where the pastor's wife had a good supper prepared, which we enjoyed. Then came time for the evening service. A good attendance showed up, and the singing was especially good as we all praised the Lord in song. Then the message, the invitation, and dismissal. Good-byes were said and we returned home.

The pastor at the San Antonio station had gone to Barranquillo for a few days of special services, so we supplied in his church on Sunday. This village is about a half an hours drive in the Jeep from Jalapa. We arrived in good time for the Sunday School in the afternoon. Some 52 came for the classes. After Sunday School was dismissed we visited in different homes in the village, ate a light supper that the pastor's wife prepared, and then went back to the church for the night service. The Lord gave us a good service, which we feel was an inspiration to all.

The following Wednesday, we again took to the road in the Jeep, which brought us safely to Los Achiotes. The young pastor there is Saul Martinez. He is single, and really consecrated to the Lord and the cause of holiness. He has been staying in the home of one of the believers; but some time ago it became evident that he needed a house where he could be by himself, though he could still get his meals at the believers home. One of the men in the congregation let him have a place on his lot to build his house. Many of the houses in the village are just thatched huts, so the men helped him get poles and hay, and helped with the work. Saul is somewhat of a carpenter, so I bought some slabs from the sawmill here in Jalapa to make the sides of the house, which is more satisfactory than just hay. Now the pastor has a nice one room parsonage, with a total cost of a little less than five dollars.

The next place on the schedule was Rio Grande which was visited over the week end. Since it looked as though the boys would need the Jeep and station wagon both, here in Jalapa, we went on the bus that connects Jalapa with the railroad service. Two of the ladies from the Monjas congregation went along with wife and me. We left Saturday morning, and rode to Las Palmas, and from there it was a trip on foot for two miles or more, up and down hills. Not being used to climbing, we greatly felt the effects in sore limbs. After dinner and a little rest we visited homes, then had a prayer and praise service at night. This visit to Rio Grande was a time of blessing to us missionaries as well as to the native Christians. They always appreciate a visit of any of the missionaries who can go to visit their stations.

There are two more main stations to visit, but no definite plans are made as yet for these trips.

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"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." Matt. 28:19, 20
