REPORT OF GENERAL CONFERENCE By Lola Stout

As delegates and visitors gathered for the opening sessions of the third general conference of the Bible Missionary Church on June 21, 1959 at the Kansas State Holiness Camp at Wichita Kansas, the Lord moved in a most precious manner. Truly Sunday was given as a day of worship to the Lord. In the opening message of the Conference on Sunday morning, Rev. Glenn Griffith challenged us to enter Gethsemane. In the solemn moments after the message the communion was served to the great crowd of melted hearts. Rev. Spencer Johnson, blessed of God, brought a holiness message in the afternoon and a number of folk sought the blessing. The night service was given to evangelism. Rev. Elbert Dodd preached a stirring evangelistic message on the subject,

"The Two Death Marches." Holy Ghost conviction settled down on the service and the altars were filled with seekers.

There was a wonderful sense of God's presence Monday morning as Brother Griffith brought a brief message and then began to organize to proceed with the business sessions of the Conference. In all the business there was the sweet presence of God. In the discussions and debates a tenderness and kindness and a wonderful spirit of God prevailed among all the brethren. Questions pertaining to the moral and spiritual welfare of the church were discussed thoroughly and frankly throughout the conference in a Christlike and humble spirit.

In the song service Monday night, great waves of glory struck the camp. People shouted, ran the aisles and praised God for nearly an hour. The glory was on. At times it would seem that the tide would go down and the regular order of the service proceed, but then spontaneous, singing and shouting would break out again. Such glorious freedom! After some time it seemed in order to proceed with the service. Rev. Richard Boynton, chairman of the Bible Missionary Institute at Rock Island. Ill. was led of God in that Monday night service as he brought a heart searching message that moved the delegation to a love feast of untold dimensions. Such self abasement and such confessing of short comings, and failures, and such glory! The service beggars all description. Many had never seen such manifestations of God's outpouring. The service continued until near midnight. Many were reluctant to leave, we were treading upon holy ground. The spirit carried over until the next day. God moved in a melting way in the morning session and the session did not adjourn until 2:00 P.M. God was melting this regiment of the invisible church to meet the crisis of the hour.

Tuesday. night God used Rev. J. E. Cook as he preached on Gideon: When he hit the high note. "Blessed are ye when men shall revile you and persecute you and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely for my sake, for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you," shouts of praise burst forth and men took for the aisles. It was an old fashioned meeting for sure. And again God filled the altars with seekers. The business ran so smoothly that all the business of the conference was finished by Wednesday afternoon. Wednesday night the closing message was brought by Rev. Paul Drummond and again as in all the other services, seekers were at the altar and God met the need of hungry hearts and souls.

Rev. Dennis H. Reiff, our Missionary to Guatemala brought a stirring message and challenged our hearts to do more for missions. Rev. J. E. Ray delivered a message in the school service and \$15,000 was pledged for the Bible Missionary Institute. Brother J. C. Gomilla reported on the work of the Children's Home at Beulah Heights, Kentucky.

Rev. Glenn Griffith and Rev. Elbert Dodd were both re-elected as General Moderators with a wonderful vote of confidence. The Bible Missionary Church appreciates the wonderful spiritual leadership that God has given it in our beloved General Moderators.

Throughout the conference We were blessed by the wonderful singing by the gospel singers of the movement. Consecrated talent sang the glory down again and again. Young people with their instruments played to the glory of God those blessed gospel songs that cause the saints to rejoice. For the Wonderful fellowship, for the Good conference and most of all for the Presence of the

Holy Ghost in our midst, we praise God. the Father. God the Son and God the Holy Ghost. -- Lola E. Stout, Reporter.

EDITORIAL By Spencer Johnson

THE MENACE OF HOLINESS

"Then said I, Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts." (Isa. 6:5) "And great fear came upon all the church, and upon as many as heard these things." (Acts 5:11) "For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness. He therefore that despiseth, despiseth not man, but God, who hath also given unto us his holy Spirit." (I Thess. 4:7-8)

Men often speak and write of the blessedness of holiness. The Holy Ghost is properly called the "Comforter" for He is the great "Paraclete" who is capable of abiding in the hearts of men forever. But there is another side to holiness that is often overlooked. To some the Holy Ghost is the "Comforter" but to others He is a terror. Everyone does not look upon Him as the spring head of "living fountains of water." He is typified by burning, consuming fire as well as by the Dove of peace. To some He is a disturber and a dangerous menace, depending upon the attitude of the individual.

Holiness is a menace to a closed and prejudiced mind. It was a closed mind that passed up Bethlehem and the manger and rejected Christ because He was not born at Jerusalem. Many professed holiness folk today reject the same old time rugged preaching of holiness that won their fathers, because they are prejudiced against the name of the church that preaches it. They will reject this wonderful, joyous, cleansing experience because of the humble approach that must be made to receive it.

It was a closed mind that asked, "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" It is amazing to hear people criticizing and belittling a church when they have never attended one of the services. Many are afraid to visit an old fashioned church or holiness camp for fear that the glorious presence of the Triune God would disillusion their poor prejudiced minds. Only a closed mind could look on the humble, honest, clean, victorious sanctified lives of people: who have this experience of holiness and who hold the confidence of their neighbors and business associates, and then declare that they are wrong simply because they do not wear the same denominational tag.

In one of his books, B. Carradine tells of a presiding elder that spoke to a sanctified preacher on his district, and said, "I recognize your lovely spirit, excellent life and faithful ministry, but I can not endorse you theory." The preacher replied: "Well, here is a remarkable thing. Suppose I am presented with an apple which is large and rosy, has a pleasant smell and delicious taste; and I say to it, Apple, you are large, rosy fragrant and luscious, but I can not endorse the tree that grew you. Now brother, this speech would not be more surprising and unreasonable on my part than yours to me; for you admit that my spirit and life are all right and

gospel labors successful, and yet you refuse to endorse the very blessing by which I obtained this spirit and achieve this success."

Closed minds today refuse new light. If the great and the learned and the powerful do not teach it, they reject it.

Holiness is a menace to selfish and exploiting interests. The rich young ruler went away sorrowful when he saw the plain requirements for Christian Perfection. In the white light of a full-orbed revival after Pentecost, Ananias and Sapphira died under the stroke of God because they kept back part of the price. It is still death to men, spiritually, to profess holiness and keep back part of the price. It is a dangerous thing for a preacher or a church to profess holiness and then prove by the miserly, selfish use of all their money on their little local program that they have no vision for missions or the general work of God's kingdom abroad. When preachers and laymen can live in good homes, drive the latest cars and then give less than a week's pay a year to the cause of missions it is evident that their motives have not been purged. We wonder if, at the coming of Jesus, they will not feel very much like the Pharisees when Jesus exposed their cold-hearted lack of love.

Was it not a dangerous thing for the two disciples and their mother when they exposed themselves by their place seeking? It is interesting to note how some men will support the cause as long as the bauble of position or place is before them and then lose interest in sacrificing when the coveted prize seems beyond their grasp. Holiness is a menace to the world's greed because it makes men utterly unselfish.

Holiness is a menace to the casual and formal professor of religion. There is no place in a sanctified heart for an unforgiving spirit. The holy man is always quick to forgive and refuses to hold the sins and mistakes of the past over the head of the penitent who sought his forgiveness. One can cross a real sanctified man without endangering fellowship.

The formal professor of religion does not wish to expose himself to the burning experience of holiness. Holiness has always been a rebuke to worldly pride. Women who profess religion and still cut their hair, wear jewelry and dress immodestly along with people who watch television and attend such worldly places of amusement as the dance, the show, the race track, rodeos, skating rinks, ball games and bowling alleys may all be at ease in a cold formal atmosphere. But let the Holy Ghost descend in mighty power, with blessings for the saints and conviction for sinners and their hearts will be pricked and condemned before God. Jesus had His greatest trouble from cold professors of religion, so did Paul and so do true people of God today. A spirit of complacency cannot exist simultaneously with a burning experience of holiness. "Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that out darkness for fight, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter! Woe unto them that are wise in their own eyes, and prudent in their own sight!" (Isa. 5:20-21)

Holiness is a menace to evil doers who defy the laws of God. Herod was terrorized by the news of the holy Jesus. His position was in danger. His selfish greed was threatened. His whole rotten way of living was in danger. Holiness is still the antipode of sin. There are multitudes who would be scared almost to death if Jesus should come today. The sin in their lives haunts them

when they are in the company of good people and it will render them speechless in the presence of Jesus!

A mighty aggressive, Holy Ghost revival: is the need of this dark day. Such a revival would bring more rebuke to sin and prepare more hearts for the coming of Jesus than all the laws and social reforms in the world.

Where is the church that is doing all that she can to promote this mighty experience of holiness? What evil force any longer fears the influence of any church? The liquor traffic moves on its damnable course without a protest. Tobacco companies flaunt their advertising on every hand. The scarlet sin of prostitution is rampant in the land. Murder and crime is on the constant increase. Gambling and lottery is unrebuked. Why are the pulpits so silent on these things? Has the Devil stopped all the mouths of the preachers? "His watchmen are blind: they are all ignorant, they are all dumb dogs, they cannot bark; sleeping, lying down, loving to slumber. Yea, they are greedy dogs which can never have enough, and they are shepherds that cannot understand: they all look to their own way, every one for his gain, from his quarter." (Isa. 56:10-11)

Where is the church that is awake to the tremendous responsibilities of this tragic hour. Where is the church that is praying and agonizing for souls and the return of her Lord? Where is the church that is bright as the sun, fair as the moon, and as terrible as an army with banners? Awake, O Zion, put on thy strength!

LET US SAVE OUR CHILDREN By Paul Finch

The Bible Missionary Church is definitely recognizing the vacuum created by a non-Christian and secular education. The purpose of this letter is to set in motion a few simple principles that will guide us, as a body of Christians, into a Christ-centered education for the spiritual benefit of the children.

First, we should become aware of the trend in state education. Banned from most public schools is the right to teach the Bible. Thus, in a tax supported institution, there is no infringing on

the beliefs of Jews, Protestants, Catholics or Atheists. Only secular subjects are taught. "Secularism," said C. C. Morrison, editor of the liberal Christian Century, over a decade ago, "is only another word for Atheism." Also, said he, "The public school creates a secular mentality faster than the Church can christianize it," the result being that children from our Christian homes find their educational house divided. A mental battle is daily in progress. Years ago, Daniel Webster said in the Girard Will case, "It is mockery and an insult to common sense to maintain that a school for the instruction of our youth, from which Christian instruction by Christian teachers is rigorously shut out, is not deistic and infidel both in its purposes and tendencies." This trend has been increasing for over 100 years and today's social problem reveals the tragic result in going from the little red school house to the centralized school.

Secondly, we should have a proper evaluation of true education. Protestantism originally taught children to read so that they might be able to read the Bible and understand their duty to God. When we allow the corner drugstore, radio, TV, comics, Hollywood, secular-minded public schools and tobacco and liquor industries to educate our youth, we must not be surprised if Holy Ghost revivals wane, and crime, delinquency and paganism sweep our nation off its feet. The materialism of the 19th century began robbing man of a strong confidence and faith in God, resulting in the race reverting back to paganism. One modern writer said, "The idea of sin must be banished." This generally accepted concept is locking the minds of men to any great revival move of our day. The sensual, materialistic practice of pagans is becoming the way of life in our present day. So far, it is not so ugly, because it is covered by the glamour and the wealth of our fabulous yet waning civilization. Beloved, if under God, with a definite purpose, we can get to the heart of truth, the key can be turned to open the door to the souls of this deluded and dizzy generation. A simple, yet correct evaluation of true education is our present objective.

Thirdly, we must acknowledge the tremendous inroads of modernism and liberalism into the education of holiness circles. Classroom methods in our holiness schools are rapidly adopting the godless ways of secular education. The lack of restraint, preeminence of sports, use of movies, atheistic textbooks, the almost total absence of moral standards in every realm, and the subtle, as well as bold, suggestions to discredit the Divine Authority of the Bible, seeking state accreditation at the sacrifice of spirituality and Divine accreditation, are a few of the ways that true education has been tampered with. The result: spiritual deadness, crime, drunkenness, prostitution, pleasure mad youth, tremendous debts and little or no fear of God before men's eyes.

Fourthly, we must realize our duty to give our children a guarded, Christian education. This does not imply eliminating any normal social, physical, or mental activities that produce a wholesome and healthy outlook on life. It would signify the supplying of the essential spiritual ingredients, which are so lacking in today's education. The Creator of Society has laid the obligation for the education of children, not at the door of the State or the Church, but primarily at the door of the family. Deut. 6:6, 7. Let us accept this responsibility, that the stream of boys and girls flowing from our homes may be a spiritual asset to society. We must begin early when our children are at our knees. When the time comes for their formal and academic training, their first years of school should see them under real Christian teachers, so that, when older, their hearts will be united to love God faithfully. The education of our children today should be a God-centered education.

JESUS CHRIST THE MISSIONARY IMPERATIVE By James McNab

I. His Example

11. His Great Commission or Direct Commands -- In our study of the Missionary Imperative in the Life, Teachings and Example of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, it was difficult to know where to place this brief section on the "Great Commission" or direct commands of Christ. They could very accurately be included in "The Missionary Imperative in His Teachings, as they were actually a part of the post-resurrection teachings of the Risen Savior. However, since these direct commands were issued by the Master, and since the main reason for obeying them is because of Jesus Christ, Himself, rather than the commands, it was decided to include them under the "Missionary Imperative in His Example."

The statement has already been made that, even if there were no "Great Commission" or direct commands, there is sufficient missionary imperative in the life, teachings and example of Christ, to send every Christian into all the world to make known the glorious Gospel which is Jesus Christ, Himself. Furthermore, even if there were no teachings in which is found the GREAT MISSIONARY IMPERATIVE, there is enough in His life or example to compel or constrain every true believer to make Him known to THOSE WHO HAVE NEVER HEARD.

Jesus Christ was the PREDOMINANT EXAMPLE of the "Great Commission," before He commanded His disciples to be His representatives in ALL THE WORLD. He had been sent by the Father and had finished the work committed to Him by the Father, before He said to His disciples: "... as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you" (John 20:21). Even without the direct commands uttered, the INHERENT MISSIONARY EXAMPLE of His LIFE is SUFFICIENT to SEND EVERY ONE INTO ALL THE WORLD. William E. Daughty declares that: "Across two thousand years Christ has been calling men to go into all the world and win it. During these centuries He has not changed His mind. No clash of ideas, no rising tide of color, no assaults of enemies can still that voice. No thunder of guns in a war-mad world can silence or drown out that cry. The world changes, time marches on, the experiences of men expand, adding new complexities, new outlook, vaster opportunities, yet this call sounds on undiminished, unintimidated, imperishable. It challenges us on every highway of the world. The centuries are but a megaphone to make the modern world hear it distinctly."

This is indeed true because Jesus Christ Himself is the "Great Commission." He has been and still is calling MEN and WOMEN to represent HIM, HIS TRANSFORMING GOSPEL, in EVERY PART OF THE WORLD, before ALL NEEDY PEOPLE. But before He began this call

through His direct commands, or through His teachings, HE HIMSELF WAS AN EXAMPLE of what He called His disciples to do. Therefore, this "Great Commission" is imperative primarily and unreservedly because of the LIFE and EXAMPLE of the ONE WHO GAVE THESE DIRECT COMMANDS.

His life and example has always been and ever will be the REAL CONSTRAINING FORCE. It was the "Love of Christ" rather than the "Great Commission" itself which constrained or compelled the Apostle Paul (II Cor. 5:14). It was Christ, Himself, His sacrificial, MISSIONARY CENTERED life, and His GREAT LOVE FOR A LOST WORLD, which compelled the early Apostles and disciples to proclaim Him to ALL THE WORLD. It was the INSPIRATION OF HIS LIFE, and TEACHINGS, and EXAMPLE, rather than His direct commands, or "Great Commission," which fashioned their consecrated hearts and lives.

This is by no means a minimizing of the "Great Commission" of Jesus Christ, but rather a different view than that usually taken by writers on the direct commands of Christ. Most studies or writings on the direct commands have emphasized the "Great Commission of Jesus Christ,'.' rather than the Christ Who issued the "Great Commission." It is His example, or He Himself, which must ever be the primary, compelling, missionary imperative. Consequently, it is true that, even if the commands of Christ had not been spoken, or having been uttered, they had not been preserved, "The missionary duty of the Church would not be in the least affected."

Jesus Christ is the "Great Commission" and, because He is, there shall ever be the "Great Commission" until time shall be no more. However, it is much more than just an IMPERATIVE COMMAND or the DIVINE SON of GOD, the SAVIOR OF THE WORLD. Without Christ and His MISSIONARY LIFE LIVED, there could be no "Great Commission." Without His loving, sacrificial death on the Cross, and His glorious, triumphant resurrection, there would be no direct commands or "Great Commission."

Consequently, it is the "Great Commission" because it was given by Jesus Christ, Himself, the VERY SON OF GOD and the ONLY ONE WHO COULD GIVE SUCH A COMMAND. This is unmistakably true because without Jesus Christ and His life lived, there would be no Gospel to offer to a LOST WORLD. Christ was and is the ONLY WAY BACK TO GOD for ALL MANKIND alienated from Him through the first Adam's sin.

"The Great Commission is also a great permission," asserts A. J. Gordon, and there is seen in its divine command to preach the Gospel to every creature also a divine warrant for drawing upon God's treasury for ALL funds necessary to carry out the command or charge. Kilbourne maintains that: 'To the disciples of Jesus there is no greater charge intrusted, no greater duty impressed, than that involved in the Great Commission, 'Go ye.' " This is true, however, only because Jesus Christ was the MISSIONARY EXAMPLE before He commanded His early disciples, and "All those who would believe in Him through their word" (John 17:20), to be His missionaries.

Therefore, the "Great Commission" as found in its varied forms in the Four Gospels and in the Acts (of the missionaries) of the Apostles, is one of the IMPERATIVE MISSIONARY EXAMPLES of Christ TODAY. And because HE IS STILL OUR BEST MISSIONARY EXAMPLE, His love and our love for Him should compel us, no matter what the cost might be, to take Him, the GLORIOUS Gospel, to those who HAVE NOT HEARD!

FALSE HOLINESS By J. L. Hysel

The present time is an age of shams, counterfeits, adulterations and false mixtures in almost every walk of life. Religion is not free from them. Much is accomplished by the principle of substitutions and the enemy has done much harm by offering the sham for the real. The Lord warns us against the false by exhorting us to obtain the real experience, "and that ye put on the new man,

which after God is created in righteousness and TRUE HOLINESS." In these days it has been popular to preach and profess holiness, but often times, I believe, it is not the kind the Bible teaches us to have.

We would like to call your attention some of the phases of False Holiness.

False holiness is often founded upon wrong conception of justification. We have a so-called holiness today that is teaching after you are sanctified you are cleansed from your habits, etc. To further illustrate, upon coming on the field in one of our pastorates, the former pastor was introducing me to some of the people. Upon meeting one cigarette smoking brother, not mine, I asked after we left if he was supposed to be a Christian. Oh yes. Well he is smoking. Oh, but he hasn't been sanctified yet. Often upon old fashioned conviction these things fall off. In harmony with such false teachings concerning holiness, it has been heard of PROFESSORS OF RELIGION, when reproved for dressing like the world, using tobacco, watching TV and such like things reply, by the way of self-justification, "We do not profess holiness." They limit old fashioned conversion until it becomes too small to be seen and to weak to be of any good. I believe as far as the sin business, we are required to live as correct and circumspectly by the standard of justification as that of entire sanctification.

Holiness is false which is not deeply interested in the conversion of sinners. Much of the holiness of today consists in having a good time and in hiding in some corner from the outside world and getting blessed. I believe it is high time that we wake up and realize there are lost and backslidden hearts all around us. Where would we be today if it wasn't for someone who got the burden for us. Let us not crawl into our religious shell and hibernate. Let us get to work, not as a church program, but for the purpose of winning souls for the kingdom.

Holiness is false that lives in conformity to the world in dress, actions, or our everyday walk of life. God's word is plain in regard to this matter. "BE not conformed to the world, but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, love not the world, neither the things which are in the world and many other similar passages which are often taken so lightly. We have so-called holiness people who are lined up in regard to the standard of holiness but they have an ungodly, demoralizing, spirit-killing TV. Then there are others who wouldn't own one but go and watch their neighbors. If one owns one or just watches, he is backslidden in heart and might as well quit playing religion and get down and repent. Such people are only fooling themselves and enduring religion, not salvation. You can get to. a place where you can enjoy your salvation, Praise the Lord forever. It is going to take more than TV power to get to heaven.

That holiness which does not manifest the spirit of Christ before the world is false. These live selfish lives and know but little of self denial for Christ's sake. These get angry when opposed, are impatient under trial, self sympathizing, and show little of the kind, tender, loving forgiving spirit of our Savior. Genuine holiness keeps us kind, considerate, tender and patient toward all men.

The day of reckoning is near. That which is not true will go down. In the final day all that is false will go to the regions of outer darkness, while the true will enter into the portals of eternal day.

Why then are we ever indifferent in seeking to encompass the salvation of those about us? Why does our evangelistic and missionary zeal ebb low? Why do we pass opportunities for testimony and personal work? There can be but one answer: our own inner light is dim. Our vital knowledge of God has waned. The lines of demarcation between new and old and between life and death have become obtuse. Where do you line up?

ANNOUNCEMENTS

GENERAL CONFERENCE ACTION

The General Conference is the final law making authority of the Bible Missionary Church. As such it is of interest of all to note any action taken by the Conference.

- 1. The General and Special Rules were not changed with the exception of one little clause in the Special Rules relating to Sunday School contests. We will give you the specific wording on it at a later time when we receive the exact wording of it from the General secretary. All the fundamental standards of the Bible Missionary Church remain the same as they were before the conference.
- 2. The Government still remains predominately congregational. There were a few changes regarding district and General Government. These we will give in the next issue. We don't have all the details on them at hand now.
- 3. The Committee on Missions recommended that we re-enforce both the Guatemalan and British Guiana missions fields. This was adopted by the Conference.
- 4. The Conference voted to move the Bible Missionary Book Store to Rock Island, Ill. All the profits above the cost of operating the store and the payment of the Manager will be given to the support of the Bible Missionary Institute. Of course there is not a large profit at this time. The store is to be moved by September 1. We do not have the new address now but Box 775 should reach the store in as much as that is the address of the Bible Missionary Institute, in Rock Island, Ill.
- 5. The Conference voted to purchase a printing plant and set it up at Rock Island, Ill. Of course this will take some time but the committee is working on it. If you have offerings that you would like to send to help in the cost of this project mail them to the General Treasurer, Rev. L. P. Roberts, 1915 S. Perry Way, Denver, Colo. and mark them "For printing plant." It will take several thousand dollars to get this to working but in time it will pay off. Pray for this project.
- 6. The Conference voted to continue to support the General Church by the percentage plan. Each local church is to give at least 8% of its regular tithes and offerings for the support of the

General Church. This does not include building funds, revival or missionary offerings. Each local church is to give at least 2% of its regular tithes and offerings for the support of the District work. Special missionary services are to be held and missionary offerings taken.

- 7. The Conference voted for each District to take a month each year to sponsor a drive to increase subscriptions to the Missionary Revivalist. Also, that our churches use our own Sunday School literature as far as possible.
- 8. The conference voted to have the General Conference once every four years instead of every two years. In case of an emergency the Conference can meet any time at the call of the General Board.
