WHAT THE BOOK OF JOB TEACHES GOD'S CHILDREN By Elbert Dodd

Subject: What the Book of Job teaches God's Children.

Scripture: Job 1:8-12. The book of Job is one of the greatest books in all the Bible and teaches many wonderful lessons. First it teaches us that man can be perfect in heart before God in this life. "There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil." (Job 1:1)

It also teaches us that many men have the wrong conception of God. The friends of Job accused Job of being a sinner, and many other accusations were made because they had the wrong conception of God. Job had access to God through the blood of the Sacrifice and Job had a perfect heart. Since Job knew God and God knew Job and could trust him, God teaches all His children a lesson through the life of Job.

Job also was a true steward of God. When everything had been swept away, Job testified that the Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away; blessed be the name of God. Job did not have the ownership complex, but rather the conception of the true man of God. He said, "This I have in my hands is not mine, but God's" This is the way with all of God's children. No man can be selfish and be a Christian. Christians are unselfish.

The book of Job proves that a Christian can be prosperous and blessed with finances, yet be true. It also teaches that a Christian does not tie himself to materialistic things. It further teaches that prosperity is not a sign that the individual is God's child.

God shows through this book why the righteous suffer. God lets them suffer financial loss to prove the devil is a liar. God does not have to build hedges around His children these blessings from God are not hedges.

This book also reveals that God allowed Job to see himself. "Then Job answered the Lord, and said, I know that thou canst do everything, and that no thought can be withholden from thee. Who is he that hideth counsel without knowledge? therefore have I uttered that I understood not; things too wonderful for me, which I knew not. Hear, I beseech thee, and I will speak: I will demand of thee, and declare thou unto me. I have heard of thee by the hearing of the ear: but now mine eye seeth thee. Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes." (Job 42:1-6)

This incident in the life of Job was permitted to prove God's love to His children. "If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons; for What son is he whom the father Chasteneth not? But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons. Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected us, and we gave them reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live? For they verily for a few days chastened us after their own pleasure, but He for our profit, that we might be partakers of His holiness. Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby." (Hebrews 12:7-11).

Also this trial allowed Job to get a clearer view of his Redeemer. It also teaches the resurrection. Job was assured ,that he would rise again. "For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God" Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; though my reins be consumed within me." (Job 19:25) Praise God for revealing this truth to us through the book of Job!

HOLINESS AND THE MILLENNIUM

Webster's Revised Unabridged Dictionary defines millennium: "From Latin mille a thousand plus annum -- a year a thousand years, especially the thousand years mentioned in the twentieth chapter of Revelation during which holiness is to triumph throughout the world." During this time the Devil Will be bound and Christ shall reign with His saints upon earth. (Rev. 20:2:4)

The Millennium is separated from the age in which we live by the coming of Christ for His bride, the sanctified people of all ages. The righteous dead shall be resurrected and the living saints translated. While the saints are at the marriage supper of the Lamb the: awful tribulation takes place upon the earth. "For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be." But the world powers are limited, and then comes another state of affairs, when God shall put down the mighty from their seats and exalt them of low degree. RETROSPECTION April 1945 -- April 1965

The dictionary states that one meaning of "score" is twenty. Most of us remember the tale of "Rip Van Winkle" and his twenty year sleep. We recall the bewilderment "Rip" felt as he endeavored to grasp the happenings and changes of a double-decade which passed while he slept.

What an education would await the modern "Rip" if he had fallen asleep in April of 1945!

Twenty years ago this month, Franklin Delano Roosevelt was still in the White House, but before the month had passed he was replaced by the little man from Missouri.

America was still at war, but a nervous peace would soon be signed. The world's first nuclear weapon was soon to be exploded over Hiroshima. The sell-out of Potsdam and Yalta was not yet apparent to most of us.

The frightening decline of our moral fiber was alarming to some, but was "progress" to others. Elvis was still in Tennessee, and the "beatles" were just tots somewhere in England. "Turn backward, turn backward, Oh time in thy flight . . ."

Television, with it's eye of evil influence and ejection of moral and intellectual rot, was still in the future in that April of long ago.

One of the contributing factors to the crossing of the stormy Atlantic by the Pilgrim Fathers, according to our history books, was their refusal to adorn themselves with the wedding band, and this was still the thinking of much of the laity in the holiness churches in the middle "forties." But things were happening behind closed doors in "high places." Soon, to be "loyal" you had to be "ringed."

(Life Magazine, June 1951, states that 850,000 wedding rings were manufactured monthly. Ten million a year! Yet, in 1951, there were only 1,669,934 weddings. Six rings manufactured .for one wedding! No doubt many used for immoral purposes.)

The Revised Standard Version (Perversion) of the Bible was in the mold but would not make a general appearance until the following decade. The wobbly, anemic stand of the leadership, "who knew not Joshua," on this desperate issue brought clearly into focus the rent in the holiness ranks.

Ten years following the historic year of 1945, the Bible Missionary Church made it's appearance. God only knows what all the captains and crew have gone through. "In perils of robbers, in perils by (our) own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren". Praise God, He has guided us through!

Recently the world mourned the passing of Sir Winston Churchill. Again we have been reminded of Dunkirk, and the battle of Britain. Again we have thrilled to those famous words, "Never have so many owed so much to so few."

Today, the "Neville Chamberlains" of the religious world are appeasing the "Hitlers" of modernism and hell who would destroy every part and parcel of "the faith once delivered." While men in places of leadership refuse to shave on Sunday, and retain other like "personal convictions," they have sold the "Glory" for personal reputation, position and church unity.

As in those dark days of 1940, when the British looked for someone or something to help them, so are thinking people looking for help today, even as they feel the icy waters of worldliness and compromise washing away the foundations at their feet.

A few weeks ago I witnessed the widow of the first Mayor of Bethany, Oklahoma, as she quietly walked to the front of the church and said "I do" as the pastor read the page from our Manual entitled "Reception of Members." She was born in the fire and couldn't stand the smoke."

Recently an official of a holiness denomination told this writer, "You have no idea the pressure being applied to force us to compromise." An older student at a holiness school observed to a friend of mine, "We have long since lost the battle for holiness standards, and are now gripped in desperate battle to retain our doctrine." Remember, reader, "It is only a step from questioning Bible standards, to questioning Bible holiness!"

I say, are we equal to the challenge of our day? Will the coming generation be able to say, "We owe so much to so few!" Gideon's history reminds us that God delights to deal with minorities. He tested the throngs of Gideon's until only 300 remained of 32,000. And one of the tests was how they drank water! But that little band put to flight the host of the Midianites!

If Jesus tarries another twenty years, and in 1985 another "Rip Van Winkle" could awake to scan the pages of history, what would our record reveal?

No, I'm not pleading for world: wide revival. Not a word of Scripture to support it. Nor am I expecting us or anyone else to change the evil course of this world. (II Timothy 3"13) But I feel God does expect us to "lift up prayer for the remnant that is left." (Isaiah 37:4) To occupy till He comes. (Luke 19:13) To insist on conversion that converts, and holiness that sanctifies. Anything less will be "spued out" shortly. (Revelation 3,:16)

It is my understanding that pure gold is distinguished by three tests.

First. The keen eye of the jeweler. The cheap, gaudy imitation is cast aside.

Second. Acid is applied. This results in another separation.

Third. Finally, what has passed the first two tests is placed in the scales. Lightness means "mixture" "alloy".

Only pure gold passes all three tests. Much is "weighed and found wanting." Job said, "He knoweth the way that I take: when he hath tried me, I shall come forth as gold." (23:10) Will we?
